Take the height and ruggedness of Bill Enyart and the jumping jack qualities of Steve Davis...

Medford subdued the Axemen 83-73 to square a week end series with the Willamette Valley quint. South won Friday 67-63.

Couch Frank Roelandt's whirlwinds did not start off with a blaze of fire. They warmed slowly to their chore. South was ahead in the early going...

Free Throws Ward Off Medford forced a 12-point lead before the talented, persistent and opportunist Axemen of Coach Hank Kuehner surged back...

Barnes with 22 points and a Vowell with 21 spurred the Medford scoring and were backhaws and playmakers. Two other hurricanes were in double figures...

Although lagging at the start, Medford had 18-17, 42-36 and 60-51 gaps at the quarter break. While vigorous application was a key for Medford...

South hopped off to a 4-0 starting lead on buckets by George Myrno and Pinkstaff and then led 8-3 and 11-4. A long push by Vowell, a bucket by Bertrand on a Vowell feed and two free points by Allen put Medford on top for the first time at 12-11.

Then followed 11 lead switches, an almost basket for basket trading. Eugene went ahead 27-26 on a turn and drive by Shearer. On a Don Lawson swipe and drive on a Shearer drive of the base line and on a Pinkstaff free shot South extended to 32-26.

Medford came up on a push by Barnes, an Enyart rebound and a Vowell jumper for 32-all. Lawson and Barnes traded drivers and Myrno sliced in for a goal for 36-34 as each club seemed to be able to pierce the defense of the other.

Vowell collected two free tallies to tie the score again and with 1 1/2 minutes left in the half Vowell netted a rebound try for 38-36. Medford was on top to stay. Enyart's turning jumper and Allen's basket on a Barnes feed made it 42-36 at the half.

Lead Cut To 69-56 In the early third period Medford upped its advantage to 12 points at 52-40 and 54-42. But, the Axemen, a team alert to opportunity and with the ability to cash in on mistakes of a rival aggregation, crept back. They picked up five points in the first minute of the fourth quarter and the Medford lead was down to 60-56.

Although Eugene outgunned Medford 8-4 from the field in the closing canto, this was as close as the Axemen could come. The Tornadoes made 15 of 13 free toss tries in this final clincher with Barnes hitting five of six and Vowell four for four. South Eugene shot six for 10.

Medford had a 75-62 spread with three minutes left to play. The difference three times was cut to nine points. Bertrand made all six of his free shot tries. Barnes fired 8 for 9 and Vowell seven for nine.

Outcome of the fray gave Medford a 1-3 record for the season and South a 2-1 standing. South Eugene last Saturday was ranked No. 1 A-1 school in the Oregon Journal poll of coaches. Medford was rated No. 3.

EAGLE POINT - A five-point gap built in the fourth quarter helped Glide nudge Eagle Point 43-41 Saturday night in a prep hoop contest here.

The clubs were tied 24-all going into the last stanza. Mike Radcliffe's free tosses gave the Wildcats of Glide a 36-34 lead. A Dick Wilson free shot and field goal made it 37-36 for EP. Then, Stan Young got a free point, Frank Jones a gift toss and field goal and John DeGroot a bucket for 43-37.

With just under two minutes left Linnie Mesloh put in a layup for 42-39. With 1 1/2 minutes to play Jack Rust's free toss made it 43-39. With 30 seconds on the clock, Eagle Point got the ball out-of-bounds at its end of the court. Bill Ayres scored off the throw-in play.

With five seconds to go Glide led the ball on a violation. Eagle Point took time out to set up one last effort. An Eagle drove for the basket but the ball hit his foot and he lost control of it.

Glide tried to stall in the last few minutes and Eagle Point countered with a half-court press. The Wildcats got some free shot chances and missed. Eagle Point got possession of the ball, but inability to handle the ball, something which has plagued the Eagles so far this season, kept them from capitalizing on opportunities. EP lost the ball 10 times in the last quarter.

Eagle Point had leads of 13-12 at the quarter and 25-21 at the half. Mesloh was high scorer for the game with 21 points, bringing his total to 67 for four games this season. He also picked 10 rebounds for a 55 total in the new slate.

Ayres was a steady player for EP with a good job at forward and seven rebounds. The Eagles otherwise were spotty. They had 40-34 margin on the backboards with George Adams snaring the ball 11 times. Rust had 13 rebounds for Glide.

The game was another story of free shots paying off. Eagle Point had 18 field goals to 14 by Glide. The Wildcats put in 15 of 25 charity attempts while EP made five of 12. Glide hit 212 from the field and Eagle Point 237.
