

California Education Board Taking New Look at 'Provisional' Teaching

SACRAMENTO (UPI)—When the California Board of Education adopted its new and stricter teacher licensing requirements last spring, many public school administrators believed that the action would create a spectacular teacher shortage.

The new regulations, with their emphasis on subject matter, were so much stricter than the old that administrators feared they would never find enough qualified persons to handle the growing student population.

To meet the threatened shortage, most administrators planned to make greater use of the "provisional" teaching credential, a document issued by the state for persons who have not met the regular credential (license) requirements.

But during the past several months, board members showed a dislike for the provisional credential and indicated that they might let the provisional system

People Not Getting Objective Reporting, Sen. Morse Declares

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., has charged that the American press is failing to give the American people objective reporting on major issues.

"Frequently the American press does a Pravda job on the American people," he said.

"It feeds them what it wants them to read and omits telling them what they ought to know in the news."

Asked About Incident

Morse issued his criticism when asked about an incident last week in which he protested about too much noise in the Senate press gallery.

"But that's insignificant," the senator went on. "I do have a great disappointment in the American press as a whole, for I have sat in the Senate for 10 years and I think I'm a pretty good witness in the operation of the press in handling political news, and in my judgment, the press does not do, by and large, an objective job of publishing the news."

He said he blamed editors more than reporters.

"I'd take my chances even though I've had my difficulties with the working press, in the objectivity of the working press," the senator said. "But the fact is that their stories are re-written at a higher level or they're cut out entirely at higher level."

Confidence Vote Near in Italy

ROME (UPI)—Premier Aldo Moro appeared headed toward victory today in his bid to win a crucial vote of confidence for his center-left coalition government.

Political sources predicted Moro's coalition of Christian Democrats, Marxist Socialists, Social Democrats and Republicans would win a majority in the Italian chamber of deputies.

But controversy over the new political lineup and its significance in terms of Italy's role in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) opened splits within the ranks of the Christian Democrats and the Socialists. The two parties are the major ones within the coalition.

During a meeting that lasted into the early hours this morning, Moro patted up some of the cracks in his own Christian Democratic party. Party conservatives, led by former Premier Mario Scelba, agreed to support the coalition after Moro pledged a platform based on a strong foreign policy including "full loyalty and fidelity" to NATO, and barring cold war neutralism.

The Italian attitude toward NATO was one of the most difficult hurdles in Moro's negotiations with the country's left-wing Socialists, who advocate neutralism.

The foreign policy statement, contained in a draft motion put to a Christian Democratic parliamentary group, was a strong pledge to the West than Moro's previous stand in negotiations with Socialist leader Pietro Nenni.

Two Berlins Sign Yule Visit Pact

BERLIN (UPI)—West Berlin today signed an agreement with Communist East Germany to permit West Berliners to cross through the Communist wall for Christmas visits in East Berlin.

A West Berlin government spokesman announced the agreement after long negotiations with the Communists.

It will be the first time West Berliners have been permitted in the Communist half of their city since the wall went up in August, 1961.

Testimony Begins In Klamath Trial

KLAMATH FALLS (UPI)—Opening statements were read by the prosecution and defense and testimony began today in the first degree murder trial of Archie Foster, 26, Salem.

Foster is charged with the fatal shooting of Mrs. Eunice Biss, 37, Beatty. Her body was found in a car in front of her home April 22.

A jury of six men and six women was selected as the trial got under way in Circuit Court here Monday. The jury then visited Beatty.

Circuit Judge Donald W. W. Piper is presiding.

Clarence Lane Flies Over Ashland Area

ASHLAND—Clarence Lane, better known to many as "Mr. Ashland," got his first bird's-eye view of his native town and valley when he flew with Pilot Al Porter last Wednesday.

The 93-year-old man was enthusiastic over the experience and commented "it's sure different from the days when I drove a horse and buggy over these hills."

Porter, president of Porter Aviation, Inc., of Ashland, made the flight in a 1964 Piper Cherokee, which he had brought from Florida a few weeks ago. The pilot is a seven-year veteran of the Air Corps, where he flew Jet F-101s. He has the Piper distributorship and also owns a five-place twin engine plane for charter flights.
