### Burton Divorced; Expected To Marry Elizabeth Taylor Soon

MEXICO CITY (UPI)—Friends predicted today Elizabeth Taylor will soon divorce Eddie Fisher to marry Richard Burton, whose wife Sybil got a Mexican divorce Monday. "I don't think Liz and Burton are going to wait very long," one friend said. "It looks as if they will be married soon." Burton and Mrs. Burton arranged details of a property settlement and custody of their two children before she filed for divorce in Puerto Vallarta, the tiny Mexican fishing village where he recently completed work on a movie. Miss Taylor had no part in the movie, but she accompanied Burton to Puerto Vallarta and was on the set almost every day, keeping him company. They shared a villa.

Burton's lawyer, Aaron Froesch, of New York, went to the village to represent him in civil court when the divorce was granted. Burton also was represented by a Mexican attorney, as was Mrs. Burton. Froesch said Mrs. Burton charged that her husband treated her "cruelly and inhumanly" and said he was "in the constant company of another woman."

### Five Flights Are Made by Ambulance

Mercy Flights, Southern Oregon's non-profit air ambulance service, has reported five recent flights which brought the number of patients flown since establishment of the service to 1,849. The last flight, made Tuesday, was from Brookings to Medford to bring Mrs. Marjorie Mansur to Sacred Heart Hospital for medical treatment. The previous day, Mercy Flights made a run from Crescent City to San Francisco to take Tod Evanow, 2½-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Evanow of Crescent City, to the University of California Hospital for treatment.

The other three flights were all made Dec. 14. John Branam of Rogue River was flown from Modesto, Calif., to Medford; Mrs. Elizabeth Boley of Fort Rock, Ore., was flown from Lakeview to the Community Medical Center in Sacramento; and Garland Moore of Gold Beach was flown to Medford for treatment of a skull fracture received in an auto accident early the same day. He was brought to Rogue Valley Hospital for treatment.

### Hearing Scheduled On Permit Request

A conditional use permit to allow a cold storage plant in the Wagner Creek Interim Zoned area will be considered at a public hearing at 3 p.m. Friday, Jan. 3, in the Jackson County planning commission conference room in the court-house. The permit would allow the plant for handling produce with a loading dock facility. It was partially constructed by Dave Rechtel when the residential farm zoning district in the zoned area was established. Construction of the plant at the northwest corner of the Foss Road and Walen Lane intersection was halted until the permit could be obtained. The application was referred back to the board of adjustment by the planning commission for additional hearing, consideration and recommendation.

### Family Council Kennedy Autopsy Shows Second Shot Was Fatal Bullet

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The autopsy performed on President Kennedy was reported today to show that he was killed by the second bullet that struck him, but could have survived the first wound.

The Washington Post, in a dispatch signed by its medical writer Nate Haseltine, said this was the "as yet unofficial" finding of the team of pathologists who performed the autopsy at Bethesda Naval Hospital on the night of Nov. 22 after the President's body was brought back to Washington from Dallas. The hospital, the Pentagon and the White House refused to comment on the Post story Tuesday night. White House Press Secretary Pierre Salinger, asked to comment on the report, said, "I'm not going to discuss it."

### Ruby's Lawyers Seek Psychiatry

DALLAS (UPI)—Jack Ruby's lawyers are fighting to move the strip club owner from jail to a psychiatrist's couch to seek evidence that Ruby was insane when he shot and killed Lee Harvey Oswald.

A writ of habeas corpus was filed with criminal court Judge Joe B. Brown Monday that charged Ruby was held illegally without bond and that he could not get "proper psychiatric treatment" in jail.

Dist. Atty. Henry Wade promised a pitched fight to keep Ruby in jail, because he will seek the death penalty on the murder with malice charge. He said such a charge was not bondable. Ruby was expected to appear in court for the hearing Monday.
