Tourism Is Latest Problem for Navy Men at South Pole

McMURDO STATION (UPI)—Tourism is the latest problem facing Navy planners in the Antarctic, according to Rear Adm. Bernard M. Streaun, who recently toured U. S. bases on the white continent.

Streaun is assistant chief of naval operations for fleet operations in Washington, D. C. The U. S. Naval Support Force in Antarctica is part of his command.

"According to present plans," Streaun told UPI, "the U. S. Navy is going to continue support of National Science Foundation projects on a permanent basis.

About 3,000 American servicemen together with 11 ships and 30 aircraft under the command of Rear Adm. James R. Reedy will be working here through early March to establish permanent year-round sites during the comparatively mild summer season.

Permanent bases Streaun said permanent bases will be located at McMurdo Sound, on the geographic South Pole and in Marie Byrd Land. Two additional sites, Hallett Station, a joint U. S.-New Zealand camp and Eight Station in Ellsworth Land, named for U. S. scientist James Eight, also may become permanent, he said.

"But we've been under pressure from travel agencies, particularly Australia's Qantas Airline, which wants to bring tourists to the Antarctica," Streaun said.

The tall, soft spoken admiral said he had no objection to tourists but had no intention of giving them U. S. Navy logistic support.

"We're equipped to provide logistical support—food, clothing, shelter and supplies—to our scientists. But we're not in the tourist business," Streaun said.

The Navy has advised Qantas Airlines and other travel agencies, the admiral said, that if they wish to fly tourists to Antarctica, let them bring ships to McMurdo Sound, he said.

Other reductions are considered likely in Spain, additional U. S. air bases in England are reported on the list and certain military facilities in Japan are to be reduced.

The overseas activities are at six Air Force bases and one Navy facility, it was understood.

McNamara did not indicate over how long a period the seven installations abroad would be reduced, but the shutdown of the 26 domestic facilities are to be spread over as much as three and one-half years.

Fixed Gratuity Charge Solves Tipping Problem

NEW YORK (UPI)—Including a fixed gratuity charge on bills seems like an easy way to solve the tipping problem for American overseas travelers unfamiliar with local practices.

But you can get an argument from some tourists as to whether it does or not.

Such package-plan tipping is widespread in Europe, Asia and Latin America. The charges can run from 10 to 25 per cent on hotel, food, bar and similar bills. They usually go into a general fund which is distributed to the various employees, such as bellboys, porters, waiters, bartenders, chambermaids, and other service personnel.

In addition to the fixed assessment, veteran travelers customarily leave a little extra as a token of appreciation for little extra services.

Most Americans are generous tippers and more often are guilty of over-tipping rather than under-tipping. One longtime American resident in London complained that American tourists are "spoiling" the English and other Europeans by tipping too much.

Adjust Tips
He noted that British wage standards are much lower than those in the United States and that tips should be adjusted accordingly. The same holds true in other foreign countries, he said.

A good rule of the thumb in England, he said, is to figure the shilling tip (actually about 14 cents) equivalent to a 25 cent tip at home.

Then, an American woman touring Europe alone on an all-inclusive package plan said she often was forced to dig down into her purse again and give more than she originally intended because of a glowering waiter or porter.

Americans are not the only complainers. A spokesman for the world's airlines which depend on tourism for survival complained recently about the gamut of outstretched palms travelers often must run.

Sir William P. Hildred, director-general of the International Air Transportation Association, told IATA delegates meeting in a European capital.

Overseas Base Closures Hinted

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The seven U.S. overseas air bases that the Defense Department plans to close or curtail in its economy drive were understood today to be in Spain, England and Japan.

Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara announced plans on Dec. 12 to close or reduce activities at 33 military installations. He named 26 within the United States, but said he could not identify the seven overseas pending discussions with the governments concerned.

It was reported that, under plans that have long been in the works, the huge bomber base at Zaragoza, Spain, was one of those earmarked for closing as B47 bomber forces are reduced.

Other reductions are considered likely in Spain, additional U. S. air bases in England are reported on the list and certain military facilities in Japan are to be reduced.

The overseas activities are at six Air Force bases and one Navy facility, it was understood.

McNamara did not indicate over how long a period the seven installations abroad would be reduced, but the shutdown of the 26 domestic facilities are to be spread over as much as three and one-half years.

Survey Shows Students Walk Short Distances

EVANSTON, Ill. (UPI)—College students may claim the world's record for cramming into phone booths and talking non-stop on telephones, but they fall behind when it comes to walking a foot comfort products company says.

A study conducted on the Northwestern University campus by the Scholl Mfg. Co. Inc. showed that the average student walked only 4.73 miles per day. This was compared to the mileage put in by the typical housewife, who walks 18 1/2 miles a day, the doctor, 18, and the postman, 22.

The students who participated in the study recorded their daily mileage for two weeks on meters attached to the waistband of their clothing.
