Eggnog Recipe From Louisville

Eggnog is a favorite holiday filler for the punch bowl. Here is a nog recipe from the famous Penderis Club in Louisville, in the heart of bourbon country. Here's how:

One dozen egg yolks; one pound sugar; one quart bourbon; two quarts heavy cream. Blend bourbon and sugar. Allow to stand for three hours or more. Beat yolks to a froth and combine gradually with the sweetened bourbon, stirring constantly. Allow egg and whisky mixture to stand for two and a half to three hours to cook the yolks. Whip cream stiff and fold into the mixture. Pre-chill in refrigerator. When ready to serve, place in chilled bowl and sprinkle with freshly grated nutmeg. (Under no circumstances, however, add ice to eggnog.) Makes 24 four-ounce servings.

When choosing the "Christmas bird," allow about one-half pound of ready-to-cook turkey per serving, then add more for second helpings.
