Construction of Ellis Manor at the corner of Crater Lake Avenue and Spring Street is expected to start Tuesday, according to Harold Ellis and his mother, Mrs. Ivra (Byron) Ellis, partners in the venture. The Ellis' have owned and operated Ellis Food Store, which is on the proposed site, for 19 years, Ellis said. The 27-unit apartment build-

Tickets At Lampert's Medford

Man Found Guilty Of Tax Evasion

PORTLAND (UPI)—Sheridan businessman Otto W. Heider Sr. was found guilty on two counts of income tax evasion Friday in federal court here.

Judge Gus J. Solomon also pronounced Heider's confidential secretary, Irene E. Lawrence, guilty of aiding and abetting him in preparing false returns for 1953 and 1954.

Heider, a former lawyer who was disbarred in 1959, and his secretary were allowed to remain free without bond.

The two-count indictment charged Heider with claiming a net loss of \$92,937.05 in 1953 and carrying the loss forward to wipe out a \$18,467.82 gain reported in 1954.

Judge Solomon found that Heider had a net income of \$5,000 in 1953 and that he made \$97,046.35 the following year. Most of his income came from real estate, equipment loans and a garage and repair shop.

\$46,144 Suit Is Filed in Court Here

Mrs. Chris (Inez) L. Planner, Medford, is seeking \$46,144 in damages from Sacred Heart Hospital, Medford, as the result of injuries she charges she received when she fell out of a third floor hospital window on March 30, 1962.

She is asking \$45,000 in general damages plus \$1,144.00 in special damages for medical expenses, according to the complaint filed in Jackson County Circuit Court last week.

Mrs. Planner charges that she

broke her right hip when she was delirious while suffering from double pneumonia.

She further charges the hospital was negligent, in failing to restrain her while in delirium, failing to make an adequate observation of her condition, failing to report that condition to the physician and failing to restrain her after a visitor reported to hospital personnel that she was delirious and was attempting to leave her hospital room.
