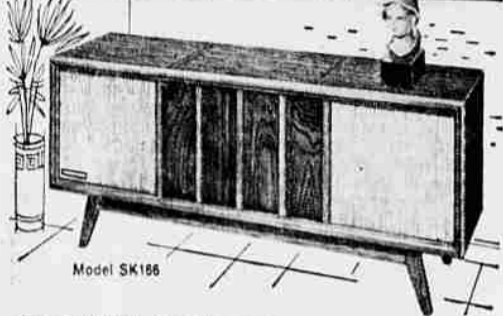

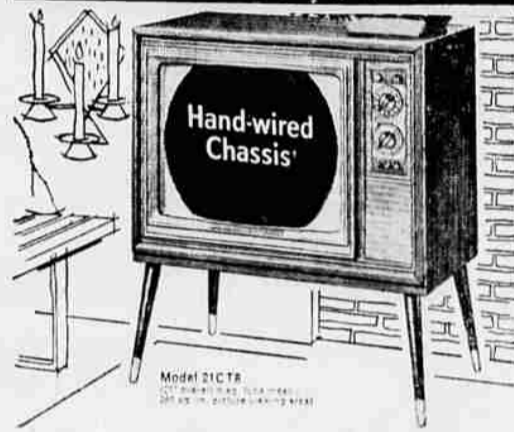

Youth Refuses To Allow Handicap To Curb Interests

MILLINOCKET, Maine—(UPI)—"Courage" is a 16-year-old boy named "George" who refused to be counted out of his favorite sports — even though confined to a wheelchair.

A freak accident in the fall of 1961 changed George Murray of Millinocket in an instant from a sported young outdoorsman, well acquainted with the pleasures of hunting, fishing and trapping, to a youth saddled with the problems of being a paraplegic.

He had been hunting in nearby woods all day and was en route home when he took a bad spill from his bicycle. The impact of his body striking the roadbed accidentally discharged a .22 caliber pistol he carried in a holster. The bullet struck him in the spine, causing paralysis from the waist down.

Broke Leg

Murray was treated for a month at the Maine Medical center in Portland and spent another six months learning how to cope with his handicap at the Hyde Memorial rehabilitation hospital in Bath.

A year later he broke a leg in a fall from his wheelchair, but by that time the tough-headed, brown-eyed youth was well prepared to slug it out with adversity and come out champ.

Murray won five first-place ribbons and two second-place awards in the last state wheelchair games held annually for the handicapped in Maine. He scored highest in the shotput, discus, javelin, archery and fowl shooting events.

His shotput record is 21 feet, 6 inches—within 3 1/4 inches of the national wheelchair record—and he hopes to compete in the national wheelchair games when he is 19.

Instead of allowing his horizons to be compressed by a cruel fate, Murray has steadily enlarged the scope of his activities and interests. He learned how to swim last summer and is preparing for his senior life saving test. He also has taken up bowling and has a candle pin bowling average of 88.

Manager Of Team

A sophomore at Searns high school, he is manager of the school's football team and accompanies it on all its out-of-town games.

His mother, Mrs. Rella R. Murray, says George is fired with "a tremendous competitive drive and a will to succeed." He hopes in a few years to enroll at the University of Illinois which admits 250 to 300 handicapped students and has special facilities for them.

Though his main academic interests now are science and poetry, Murray has set no definite goal for his career. However, he has indicated a desire to become a lawyer, psychologist or accountant.

Hospitals Employ More Last Year

CHICAGO (UPI) — Hospitals in 1962 employed 66,825 more persons than in the previous year to meet the heaviest patient demand in history, reports the American Hospital Association.

A total of 1,762,957 persons was employed in all hospitals, making the field one of the nation's largest areas of employment. For each 100 patients, 237 employees were required, said the association.
