## Eight Hurt as 4 Cars Collide

YREKA — Eight persons, four of them members of a Medford family, were injured in a four-car collision on U.S. 99 about eight miles south of here Friday evening.

All of the injuries were reported as minor.

The driver of one of the cars involved, Phillip Lawrence Fach, 56, of Calgary, Alberta, Canada, was later lodged in Siskiyou County Jail on a charge of hit and run.

The California Highway Patrol reported that Fach left the scene of the accident. A roadblock was set up at Weed and the man was apprehended there by Weed police.

The injured persons were J. Robert Bills, 26, of 1426 Yucca St., Medford, Patricia Bills, 26, Bradley Bills, 4, and Betsy Bills, 2, and Willie Henry Taplin, 40, of Seattle, Mamie Taplin, 42, Ronald Taplin, 15, and Vaughn Taplin, 16.

All were taken to Siskiyou County Hospital, where three members of the Taplin family remained overnight. The others were treated and released.

The accident, reported at 6:15 p.m., involved cars driven by Bills, Taplin, Fach and Raymond John Wood, 22, of Happy Camp.

## Dog Licenses Are On Sale in County

Dog licenses for 1964 are now on sale at the office of the Jackson County clerk in the courthouse and at the County Dog Pound, 5595 S. Pacific Highway.

Fees continue the same this year with a charge of \$2 for males and \$3 for females.

The final date for purchasing the licenses will be on March 1. Following that date, licenses include a penalty making the cost \$4 or \$5.

Owners of young dogs are required to purchase a license when the animal has acquired its permanent teeth or at about five or six months of age. Any delay will cause the \$2 penalty to be included.

Licenses will be on sale at other locations throughout Jackson County to be announced by County Dog Control Officer Chris Hagler. A newspaper application form will also be provided this year, appearing in the Medford Mail Tribune during February.

## Increase Due for Jobless Insurance

SALEM (UPI) — Maximum unemployment insurance benefits will be increased \$4 to \$44 a week, and the minimum will be raised \$5 to \$20 a week on Jan. 1, the State Employment Department reminded today.

It was estimated the increased benefits would cost about \$500,000 a year.

On Dec. 29 the unemployment insurance trust fund had a balance of \$72.1 million, compared to \$56.1 million at the same time last year.
