Our beloved Bro. Flagg, in an hysterical fit of heroics, heralds the glad tidings that the County Judge is Judge of the whole County and not of St. Helens and Houlton, apparently linking the destinies of the two places. So? Well, let it be distinctly remembered that Houlton has no particular ambition to own either the County Judge nor such a proud monument of folly as the county rock-crusher; neither is she desirous of playing any engagements as an attachment to the somnolent city of St. Helens; nor will she need the condescending protection and chaperonage of Emmanuel H. Flagg, at least until he reaches the legislative halls of the State. If Houlton does not want to be crowded off the map she had better emulate the characteristic energy of the north end of the County; and if Flagg's view of the law is correct, that the County fund can be used for building roads, she must insist on having her share. Circulate that petition, regardless of Bro. Flagg's skepticism that there are no tax payers in Houlton.

An appropriation of \$1500 by the county court is being petitioned for asking for the improvement of the Houlton-Nehalem road from the Stanwood mill to Pittsburg. This is a much needed improvement for the consideration of the court. It is true that there is a possibility of the settlers of the Nehalem Valley getting a railroad and an outlet by way of Forest Grove, but this will be a detriment to the county. The people want this improvement, and as the court has already expended a large amount of the general fund in Clatskanie and Lower Nehalem road districts since the last election it is nothing more than right that this part of the county should receive something on its roads.
