Why did they utterly disregard the people's petition in a matter of such great importance to the town?

"Constancy thou art a jewel." We notice in the last week's Review the proceedings of the City council of Jan. 1st that a bill of \$2.50 was allowed as a fee to city attorney Wright in the case of the Town of Rainier vs. Ed. Miller. The facts in this case are, that Miller was arrested by the City Marshal for disturbing the peace and brought before Police Judge. The prisoner pleaded guilty, all that was then necessary was for the Judge to fine him. But the little-city attorney saw an opening and insisted that, though the prisoner had pleaded guilty, he must be sworn, and thus secure a fee against the city treasurer. How consistent this looks. The little attorney insists that he is making great sacrifice to help Rainier out of her financial difficulties and he and the Dentz-Block council insist that honest labor must be taxed to get money to run the town, then the tax money is squandered in this manner. Great interest in the town, this.

### A NEW COURT HOUSE.

At the close of last Saturday's session of the County Court it was decided to build a new courthouse for Columbia county. We hope the action of the court will meet the approbation of the people of the whole county, as well as it does the citizens of Houlton and St. Helens. The following is a copy of the order of the court:

In the matter of the building of a new court house and the selection of a site for the location thereof.

At this time this matter coming on for hearing, and the Court being sufficiently advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court, that the Strand in front of the Court House be, and the same is hereby selected as the site for the location of the new Court House building, provided that the City of St. Helens vacates that part of the street which would be needed for said building and grounds, and provided further, that the title to said land be conveyed to the County of Columbia, and land to consist of all that part of said strand lying East and in front of Lots 15 to 20 inclusive of Block Eleven in said city of St. Helens.

And it is further ordered by the Court, that the Clerk be, and he is hereby directed to advertise for Plans and Specifications for a Court House, the cost of same to be, between \$15000.00 and \$250000.00 to be submitted to the County Court at its next meeting, which will be Wednesday Feb. 24th, 1906, and that said notice be published in the Evening Telegram for one week, and that the Clerk furnish all the County papers with a copy of this order.
