The remnants of the old political machine in Portland are in the hands of Jack Matthews, who is engaged in an effort to reconstruct it for the purpose of modifying the Primary Election Law, and to thus hold his job of auctioning off the senatorial certificate of election at Salem next winter. He undoubtedly has behind him the railroad and other moneyed interests that are fully alive to the fact that under the provisions of the statute they will be unable to send to the United States Senate one of their attorneys. And the whole row and hubbub being made in opposition to the enforcement of the law has its beginning and end in the interests named. No aspirant for office who is out with his petition for nomination is kicking about the law. Indeed most of them are glad to be freed from the domination and graft of the machine, realizing that they at least have a fair chance to win on their individual merits and personal popularity with the people than they had under the old convention method with its incident trickeries combinations and bribery. In the power to name the candidates resides the potentiality of every political machine. Boss Tweed it was who said: "You may elect whichever candidates you please to office, if you will allow me to select the candidates." Boss Matthews of Portland has his candidates for the United States senate already selected, and his efforts are being directed to the enforcement of their election by the legislature regardless of the peoples wishes. His choice is of infinitely more consequence, to him and those he serves, than the peoples' selection. To make them take his choice instead of their own is the meat of his opposition to the Primary Election Law. Let the people stand by the law, force every legislative candidate to take the pledge, or if it need be, defeat him at the poles with independent candidates who will pledge to abide by the peoples' will.

## RAINIER'S ARTFUL DODGER.

The Rainier Review certainly deserves much credit for its cleverness displayed last week in dodging the issues in Rainier. It most successfully evaded touching a single point. It fills up about one column editorially with a tirade against the Register's Rainier correspondent. But this is not the first time that this correspondent has been a lightning rod for the wrath of some one who was hit by his speaking against certain grafts that continue unchecked. The Review says, that it has taken a stand and proposes to stick to it and then proceeds to call the correspondent a knocker because he believes there are too many saloons in Rainier, and that it looks as though it would be better for the interests of the Town if the City council would raise the saloon license instead of taxing honest labor to give the town revenue to run on. The occupation tax is wholly uncalled for in Rainier, the only purpose of enactment this tax was an effort to dodge the necessity of raising the saloon license. There is not a thing in Rainier to-day that holds the town back more than the number of saloons that sap away its life. Not only does the town get a black eye every time a stranger passes through it as he looks out of the car windows and sees every other door a saloon, but it gets a still blacker one when law abiding citizens see that the town is run and controlled by the liquor dealers association. The Review bears the earmarks of this power, for it is a fact that when the first issue of this paper was gotten out, the first two columns of advertising were the saloon ads. These came in the first ready print and are still standing as a monument to the power behind the throne. Every paper that has ever run in Rainier but one has pursued the same policy, as the Review and all but one have failed. The only one that dared to take a stand is still running and just last week after the Court had investigated the subscription lists of all the papers in the county, declared the Register the official paper of the county because it has beyond doubt the largest bona fide list of subscriptions in the county.
