RAINIER DEPARTMENT.

The people who have secured the Ely franchise are erecting a power house on the property of Kuthford and Heacock and from the boilers of their mill will take their power. The engine and dynamo are on the ground and will be installed as soon as the building is complete.

If they defend themselves it is treason. How is it the rich can control the departments of government? In this country the political power is equally divided among men. There are certainly more poor than rich. Why should the rich control? Why should not the laborers combine for the purpose of controlling the executive, the legislative and judicial departments? Will they ever find out how powerful they are? A cry comes from the oppressed, the hungry, from the downtrodden, from the unfortunate, from the despised, from men who despair and from women who weep.
