HOOD RIVER, OR., DEC. 2, 1893. THE NEW TARIFF BILL.

Chairman Wilson of the ways and means committee has given out the proposed tariff bill. It consists principally in a reduction of the present tariff amounting to an effort to reduce the present tariff arrangements from grand to petty larceny.
