Ditch News.
The board of directors of the Valley Improvement company held a meeting on Monday. They purchased of M. O. Wheeler all the timber on his 160 acres and also secured from him right of way for the ditch and the right to maintain a headgate and take water out of Hood river on his land. Wednesday, C. A. Bell, Lou Morse and Charley Ross started for the head of the ditch to begin work by setting up the saw mill. Davenport Bros. have let the contract for building the dam to W. H. Bishop. The directors have ordered an assessment of 10 per cent on the capital stock, which is payable September 1st.

The Hood River Irrigation Co. will also go ahead with their ditch. This company will lay a pipe line from a point high enough to supply both sides of the valley with all the water needed for irrigation. This is the company incorporated by C. R. Bone, Malcolm Moody and E. O. McCoy.

The base ball game Saturday afternoon between the junior nines of Belmont and Hood River ended in an easy victory for the Hood boys, the score standing 29 to 16.
