London Purple. Is chiefly arsenite of lime, a residue obtained in the manufacture of aniline dyes. It does not contain quite so much arsenic as Paris green, and by being a by-product, it is not so constant in its constitution.

Paris Green. Is chiefly arsenite of copper. The insecticide efficiency of Paris green depends upon the amount of arsenic acid present, which is somewhat variable, ranging from 54 to 61 per cent in an analysis of five samples obtained in the market.
