Berry Crates Must Contain Full Weight. Hood River, April 28, 1897.—Editor GLACIER: The board of directors of the Hood River Fruit Growers' Union instructed the committee on distribution to see that all crates shipped shall be packed full, to weigh from 30 to 32 pounds, so that the crate will contain 24 pounds of berries, net. All berries must be prime, not being under size nor imperfect in shape nor over ripe.
