I am at present wearing a pair of pantaloons donated by a benevolent relative in the city whose wife had condemned them to the junk heap, but I'll bet a big bunch of baling wire that before the case of the Farmers of Klickitat County vs. Menominee Lumber Co. is decided finally by the federal courts, the city of Hood River will reach from Mosier to the Cascade Locks, and White Salmon will be the county seat of Kwis-whosky county in the new state of Ob-oh-eh-gonsky and the bones of the present inhabitants will have been thoroughly picked.

"Government by injunction" when set in motion by corporations is a terrible job at the very foundations of our liberties, but in the hands of the farmers is a "very present help in time of trouble, and many there be that go in thereat."
