

WILL OPEN A NEW UNDERTAKING PARLOR

The Nichols' Undertaking Parlors is a new business in this city. J. E. Nichols, who has had seven years' experience in the work of undertaking and embalming, comes here from Milton, and has secured a lease on the Schiffer building, two doors east of the former location of the Glacier office on Oak street, where he will be ready for customers, Monday, October 2.

Mr. Nichols spent three years in the employ of the Holman undertaking house of Portland, which is regarded as one of the leading establishments of this city. In the Northwest, and carries with him a splendid recommendation from Mr. Holman, who speaks in very complimentary terms of the young man and his abilities as an embalmer and undertaker.

Mr. Nichols was in business four years at Milton, where he enjoyed a splendid trade, but has located here because he regards Hood River as one of the best cities in the state. Mr. Nichols left Tuesday morning for Portland, where he spent the day purchasing supplies for his new establishment. Mrs. Nichols arrived the same evening from Milton.

Mr. Nichols is a licensed embalmer, and is prepared to treat bodies to any part of the United States. He will carry a complete stock of caskets and undertaking goods, and will also be prepared to do disinfecting scientifically. A splendid home will form part of his undertaking equipment.

IGORROTOS LIVE IN TRUE NATIVE STYLE

The Igorrote village is one of the interesting sights at the exposition. Delayed on the trip from their home in the mountains of Northwestern Luzon by tropical rains, unfordable rivers and typhoons, these strange white people reached Manila on August 1, and the exposition on September 1. Their village was ready for them in skeleton form, and since their arrival the houses have been thatched, and are now complete. It consists of numerous straw-covered huts, a pavilion in which coronal dances occur, a public building which serves as a court house, a jail and assembly place for all men's meetings, an "o-ig" or dormitory for girls and unmarried women, a "fa-wi" or men's lounge for husbands and unmarried men, and other structures necessary to give a correct representation of the home life of these people.

Among the more than one hundred tribes of the Philippine Islands the Igorrote is one of the most conspicuous, and easily the most interesting, because of his strange method of life and still stranger customs. So little known is he, that today he would be regarded as a curiosity in the city of Manila as in Portland. They are of Malay origin, of a superb bronze color, long straight hair, and remarkable physiques, although as a rule not tall. They are the only people in the Philippine Islands with a keen sense of humor. In all their movements they are singularly graceful. The men wear a breech cloth, called "G-string," and a picturesque little hat, which is not worn as a head covering but as a pocket. In their native condition the women wear only an apron of leaves, but here they wear a short skirt and queer jacket made of native woven cloth.

The Igorrote is a pagan, a barbarian in culture, an agriculturist from necessity, tilling the mountain sides with stone, forming "someteras" where they grow rice in the dry season, while others grow theirs in the wet season. This is accomplished by diverting streams so they will irrigate the someteras. He is a head-hunter. There is constant warfare between neighboring tribes, and head-hunting is not only a means of self-defense, but in a measure a pastime, for after a member has taken and brought home a human head a month is given to happy celebration. There are rites and coronations peculiar to the event and there are constant dances and feasts, which bring to the otherwise hard-worked people relaxation and social intercourse.

All Igorrotos eat dog. It is a tribal dish. No female, however, is permitted to partake of dog flesh, because it is considered to have a quality which nerves up the fighter for the head-hunting expeditions, and the Igorrotos do not care to have their women fight. Before agreeing to come to Portland, the Igorrotos exacted a promise that their customs would not be interfered with, and they are permitted to have their favorite dish at the village. The dogs are carried to the Pa-la-to-ma or public building, the dog is cut, the dog head, singed, dressed, cut up, boiled, and served in true Igorrote style.

The native industries of these people are shown in the village, and the women may be seen weaving their bright-colored cotton cloths, while the men are engaged in making rings, beads and pocket hats. Performances are given from ten in the morning to eleven at night, consisting of different dances, native songs, spear-throwing practice, sham battles, etc.

In the party are three chiefs, the first chief to leave the islands, each with a record as a head-hunter. The mimic, the first chief, according to official Spanish records, has taken seventeen human heads.

The Igorrotos are here in response to a request made by the residents of the Lewis and Clark exposition to the government of the Philippine Islands. At the St. Louis World's Fair this village was visited by President Roosevelt, Vice President Fairbanks and their families. It was endorsed by cabinet officers, senators, World's Fair officials, members of the Board of Lady Managers, press and pulpits as the most unique educational feature. The patrons are learning, too, that the Igorrote is industrious and not a mere eater of dogs.

The Igorrote village has caught the popular fancy and is largely attended. It is an educational exhibit of high order, the only one at the exposition portraying primitive man, and the little brown people are daily adding their quota to the "gayety of nations" as exemplified at the fair.
