IGORROTES LIVE IN TRUE NATIVE STYLE

The Igorrote village is one of the interesting sights at the exposition Delayed on the trip from their house in the mountains of Northwestern Luon by tropical rains, unfordable ric ers and typhoons, these strange will people reached Manila on August and the exposition on September i Their village was ready for them it skeleton form, and since their arrive the houses have been thatched, and are now complete. It consists of no merous straw covered buts, a pavillemerous straw-covered nats, a pavinc in which ceremonial dances occur, a public building which serves as court house, a jail and assembly plac for all men's meetings, an "o-lag" of dormitory for girls and unmarried we men, a "fa-wi" or dorn itory for bus and unmarried men, and other struc-tures necessary to give a correct rep-resentation of the home life of these

people.

Among the more than one hundred tribes of the Philippine Islands the Igorrote is one of the most conspicuous, and easily the most interesting because of his strange method of life and still stranger customs. So little known is he, that today he would be as great a curiosity in the city of Manila as in Portland. They are of Malay origin, of a squeet bronze color. lay origin, of a superb brouze color, long straight bair, and remarkable physiques, although as a rule not tall. They are the only people in the Philippine Islands with a keen sense of humor. In all their movements they are singularly graceful. The men wear a breech clout, called "G-string" and a picturesque little lat, which is not worn as a head covering but as a pocket. In their native condition the women wear only an apron of leaves, but here they wear a short skirt and quoer jacket made of native woven

The Igorrote is a pagan, a barbarian in culture, an agriculturist from ne cessity, terracing the mountain sides where they grow rice in the dry sea son, while others grow theirs in the son, while others grow theirs in the wet season. This is accomplished by diverting streams so they will irrigate the sementeras. He is a head-hunter. There is constant warfare between neighboring tribes, and head-hunting is not only a means of self-defense, but in a measure a pastime, for after a member has taken and brought home a human head a month is given to happy celebration. There are rite and ceremonies peculiar to the event and there are constant dances and feasts, which bring to the otherwise hard-worked people relaxation and social intercourse.

All Igorrotes eat dog. It is a tribal dish. No female, however, is permitted to partake of dog flesh, because it is considered to have a quality which nerves up the fighter for the head hunting expeditions, and the Igorrotes do not care to have their womer fight. Before agreeing to come to fight. Before agreeing to come to Portland, the Igorrotes exacted a promise that their customs would not be interfered with, and they are per mitted to have their favorite dish at the village. The dogs are carried to the Pa-ba-fu-nan or public building, the throat is cut, the dog bled, sing ed, dressed, cut up, boiled, and served in true Bontoc style.

The native industries of these peo-ple are shown in the village, and the women may be seen weaving their bright-colored cotton cloths, while the men are engaged in making rings, bas-kets and pocket hats. Performanceare given from ten in the morning to eleven at night, consisting of different dances, native songs, spear throwing practice, sham buttles, etc.

In the party are three chiefs, the first ever to leave the islands, each with a record as a head-hunter. Demingo, the first chief, according to official Spanish records, has taken

seventeen human heads.
The Igorrotes are here in response to a request made by the president of the Lewis and Clark exposition to the government of the Philippine Islands.

Hop Yield Better Than Expected. The Crop Bulletin for Tuesday,

eptember 26, says: The past week was warm and dry, except that a few small showers oc-curred in the northwest portion of the state. These showers were very beneficial to pastures and late crops, such as corn, potatoes, embrages, tomatoes, turnips and carrots. In the dry sections of the state pasturage is very short and range stock is losing flesh and getting in bad condition to meet a rigorous winter should on occur. The hop crop turned out muc better than expected both as to quality and quantity. Prunes, it is estimated, yielded about half of a full crop with the sizes larger than usual. erop with the sizes larger than usual. Potato digging is general. The crop is free from blight, but in coursquence of the dry summer it is expected that the yields will not be so heavy as usual. Apples in well kept orchards will yield from fair to good returns; in other orchards the crop is poor.
