CONSTITUTION FOR GROWER'S SOCIETY

At the request of many interested in the formation of local horticultural societies Prof. E. R. Lake, secretary of the Oregon State Horticultural Society has drawn up the following constitutions for affiliated organizations.

Article I. Name—This association shall be known as the..... Horticultural Society. Art. II. Membership—Any person interested in the general subject of horticulture shall be eligible to membership in this organization, and any such person may become a member by signing the constitution and paying the secretary, who shall issue a receipt therefor,..... dollars; provided: Any person paying ten dollars at one time shall become a life member without further dues; and provided further, that any person having done horticulture special service may be elected upon a two-thirds vote of the membership spent at any regular meeting, an honorary member.

Art. III. Dues—The annual dues of all members, except life and honorary, shall be \$..... Art. IV. Fiscal year: Section 1—All membership fees apply for the year during which they are paid, and "the year" of the association shall begin and end with the annual meeting at which officers are elected.

Art. V. Officers—The officers of this society shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer and executive committee of five, of which the president and secretary shall be members ex-officio. Art. VI. Meetings—This society shall hold (monthly) meetings. The annual meeting for the election of officers, and the transaction of such other business as the society may elect, shall be held..... on the first Saturday in December of each year.

Art. VII. Duties—The officers of this society shall perform the duties usually devolving upon officers of similar organizations, and shall hold their offices for one year, or until their successors are elected. Art. VIII. Affiliation—1st. The secretary of this society shall, at least thirty days before the date of the annual meeting of the State Horticultural Society, transmit to the secretary of said State Horticultural Society 25 cents per capita of the membership of his society, together with the membership list.

Art. IX. By-laws for the conduct of the business, and for covering the details of the duties of the officers of this society may be offered at any meeting, but no such proposed by-law shall be acted upon until the next regular meeting, at which time it may become operative upon a majority vote of the members present. Art. X.—The executive committee shall act for the society in the interim between meetings.

Art. XI. Quorum—Nine members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Art. XII. Amendments—This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the membership; provided, notice of such amendment shall have been given every active member at least thirty days prior to the action taken thereon.
