CHAMPION OF STATEMENT ONE.

Jonathan Bourne, Jr., candidate before the Republican primaries for the nomination of United States Senator in Congress, for the long term commencing March 4th, 1907, was born in New Bedford, Mass., February 23d, 1855; was a member of the class of 1877 at Harvard University; came to Portland May 16th, 1878; was a Republican member of the Oregon Legislature in the session of 1885 and the extra session of 1886; was one of Oregon's delegates to the Republican National Convention of 1888 and Oregon's member of the Republican National Committee from 1888 to 1892, and a delegate to the Republican National Convention of 1892; and was elected as a Mitchell Republican to the Oregon Legislature in 1896.

Mr. Bourne has been more prominently identified with the development of the mineral resources of Oregon than any other man in the state, having expended in the last twenty years over \$1,000,000 of his own money in the acquisition and development of Oregon mines.

While Mr. Bourne has had his residence and main office at Portland since 1878, he has had another office at New Bedford, Mass., and has carried on the business of his father's estate since 1889, which makes him familiar with many of the large interests and leading men of the East. These qualifications, in conjunction with his tremendous energy, originality, executive ability and experience in business and political affairs pre-eminently qualify him for making an able and influential Senator for the State of Oregon.

Mr. Bourne has always favored extending the direct power of the people over their government as far as possible. He was one of the leading spirits in the Initiative and Referendum movement from 1896 until it was approved by the voters at the June election in 1902. In 1904 he was a member of the executive committee of the Direct Primary Nominations League, and holds the same position with the People's Power League at this time. In all these movements he has been one of the few to guarantee the necessary expenses of preparing and proposing their measures to the people.

He says that the choice of United States Senator should be by direct vote of the people, and that the Legislature should be compelled to elect the man the people elect. To accomplish this result, he is championing Statement No. 1 of the primary elections law as the only method by which public opinion may be crystallized and made effective upon the Legislature.

In his petition for nomination he says:

 - Pure Food Laws.
 - Liberal Appropriations for Panama Canal, Coast Defenses, River and Harbor Improvements, including Columbia and Willamette Rivers, Coos, Yaquina and other Oregon Harbors, Celilo Canal, Government Canal at Oregon City.
 - Fair Share of Irrigation Fund for Oregon.
 - Loyal Support for Successful Candidates.
 - Rigid Enforcement Statement One.
 - Roosevelt for Second Elective Term.
- I desire that the following statement be printed after my name on the nominating ballot:

MANY REASONS FOR COUNTY DIVISION

Below will be found a well written and business like article espousing the cause of the new county which contains arguments in its favor that cannot be assailed. It is as follows:

Editor Glacier: Since political discussions are in order, a few words on the situation may not be amiss. For the last 15 years the people of Hood River valley have been to a greater or less extent discussing the proposition of creating a new county out of the western portion of Wasco county. The topography of the county, the industries and climatic conditions are such that our interests are somewhat at variance with the eastern portion of Wasco county. Taxpayers are also well aware of the fact that there has also been an almost steady increase in valuations and consequently a larger tax in this end of the said county for a number of years past, nor have we any assurance that this tax increasing process will be lessened in the future. We believe that we are big enough and strong enough to walk alone and at no greater expense, to say the least, than if we remain a part of said county. In fact we feel confident that we can carry on the business of Cascade county if it should be created, at a less expense than if we stay in the present county, especially if we take into consideration the benefits we would receive by having our county business attended to at the town of Hood River, Oregon.

We would not need an expensive court house for several years to come, nor would we need to pay large salaries to the incumbents of the county offices in the new county as they are receiving at this time. Of course, I believe the laborer is worthy of his hire, but the work in some departments would be less, for some time to come, in the new county.

Have we no local pride? Can we not see that county headquarters located at Hood River would bring in and keep more money in circulation right here at home? The city of Hood River now has a population of nearly 2000. It will continue to grow for many years in influence and wealth. The valley of Hood River will further add to its well renowned reputation for the production of the finest apples and strawberries. Its health-giving climate, its flowing springs of the purest water, its panoramic view of mountains and rivers is a soul-inspiring delight as well as those who live within its borders.
