Ehrek and Simpson Coppel baskets, in the car, and 23 boxes of car load, 11 ckg Twigs, was shipped to J. R. Snyder, Omaha, Nebraska.

On Oct. 9, 1903, I shipped to J. H. Bahnbach Bros. & Co., 105 Murray St., New York, 336 boxes, Jonathan, 2 boxes, Grimes Golden, and 23 boxes, Wiggins. This car was delayed in transit, but sold in New York, Oct. 25, and the growers got their checks on the 26th, Nov. 2nd.
