### SALMON IN 1909 WILL BE PLENTY

Jack Crawford, in the fish commissioner's office, says the run of salmon in 1909 will surpass all expectations. Mr. Crawford's knowledge of the salmon industry and the work done in the hatcheries is conceded on all sides as being in every way extensive. His forecast was made yesterday in a conversation on the work of the hatcheries in the state. There are fourteen salmon and two trout hatcheries in Washington, which carry millions of eggs each year, from which millions of fry are hatched and set forth on their course, to return at maturity and supply the traps and gill-nets. Included in these millions of fry is every species of salmon that swims in these waters. From statistics compiled a number of years ago, Mr. Crawford found that a vast number of dog salmon and the fry of cheaper grades of fish were propagated in the hatcheries.

Speaking of this fact he made the significant statement that it is now profitable to hatch any kind of fry available, as commercial use can be made of even the lowest species of salmon.

A close student of salmon yesterday talked of the bearing of the industry. Salmon are made to hatch, and their habits and thus assist the observer to discern what laws should be placed upon the statute books and enforced.

The difficulty of getting a law that will provide justice to trappers and canners on both sides of the line has stood in the way for years. The close season law now in effect is not satisfactory, because all traps are closed at the same time and those traps closed at the head of the river catch the fish which pass the closed traps near the ocean.

The plan of marking fish is to find out all knowledge possible concerning the course and other facts in the fish. The present international commission, some of whose members were here recently, is also bent on much light as possible on salmon, and enable those who are working for the interests of the industry to devise a plan which will successfully preserve the salmon.—Bellingham Reveille.

#### Dare Not Enforce the Law.

An examination of the assessment roll shows that very little money on deposit in the banks has been listed. Inquiry revealed the fact that while the assessor is given authority by statute to demand from the banks a statement of all deposits with banks on March 1 of each year, on which to base his assessments this was not done, and members of the state tax commission who were here the other day admitted that the state was in no position to enforce the law in this respect, for it would mean the failure of every bank in the state, as practically every depositor would withdraw his deposits just before March 1, thus creating a run on the banks and compel them to close, for, he said, there was no bank in the state that could pay off all depositors without notice, as in no case was sufficient cash on hand for this purpose, and an attempt to realize on the bank's holdings to meet this run would result in commercial disaster throughout the state.

Again, the assessing of bank deposits would eventually result in the withdrawal of all deposits, as in most counties in the state the tax rate is more than 40 mills on the dollar, and in many counties much higher, so that the depositors' taxes on his deposit would be greater than the interest allowed by the bank, therefore all small depositors and especially those having savings bank accounts, would immediately withdraw their funds and deposit them in the good old woolen national, where they are ordinarily safe, although they do not draw interest.—Bellingham Reveille.

#### Jamestown Exposition Notes.

The Jamestown exposition, near Norfolk, Va. next year will be open longer than any similar enterprise yet held in the United States. It is to run from April 30 to November 30, seven months and five days.

The arts and crafts village at the Jamestown exposition will be a feature never seen at a national celebration. It is bound to be one of the great attractions, and being something new it will be visited by millions.

The Jamestown exposition will be one vast colonial city in architecture, environment, art and industrial activity. The exposition visitor will live during his stay in an atmosphere of colonial romance and history. It is paraphrasing Napoleon's famous remark at the pyramids, "Three centuries will look down upon you."

Lee's parade, the large space set aside on the grounds of the Jamestown exposition for the drill work of the military bodies from all nations, is named in honor of Gen. Robert E. Lee, the great confederate chieftain and one of Virginia's favorite sons. These military parades and drills will surpass any that have been held.

The evolution of war craft, and other shipping will be portrayed at the Jamestown exposition next year, not by pictures and drawings, but by real wood and metal models of correct size. The three ships which brought the first settlers across from England to Jamestown will be reproduced faithfully, riding at anchor off the exposition grounds in Hampton Roads. Norfolk and the neighboring towns

and cities at tidewater in Virginia are making extensive preparations to handle the vast throngs of visitors who will attend the Jamestown Tercentennial exposition in 1907. In addition to the scores of hotels and the hundreds of boarding houses already in these cities and summer resorts by the sea, many new hotels of a temporary character, though well built, are being constructed near the grounds.

#### Beautiful Camping Site.

Modern sanitary sewerage has been installed throughout the grounds, the trees have been whitewashed and present a beautiful appearance. Electric lights by the hundreds have been strung through the camping grounds, with a double row over the main walk to the main entrance gates. Thirteen hundred camps upon this site during the fair of 1904 are even more than the average person would estimate after having passed through, but the above number will be greatly increased during the fair of 1906. Arrangements for the leasing of tents have been made, so one can pack in a truck or two all that will be needed outside of shelter. No one place in Oregon presents so good an opportunity for the "old timers" to meet and enjoy a visit that brings back many of the early and interesting experiences and pleasures of pioneer days. Make up your mind to be numbered among the many camps of a contented and jovial assembly of the Northwest's best people. Leave none at home.
