Cutting Down Orchards in Michigan.

Only when spring is sufficiently advanced to start into new life vegetation in Michigan can the extent of the severe freeze in that state last October be determined. That it is more serious than Michigan has ever suffered is certain. Parties who have recently examined their orchards find not only plum, pear and apple trees killed, but that native timber has suffered. Many orchards which appeared not to be injured from the showing of the tops of the trees were found to be dead when the trunk was examined at the snow line. Parties are now cutting out whole orchards of plum, pear and peach trees. In many cases the apple trees are injured from the splitting of the bark.

CITIES DEVELOPING ON THE NORTH BANK

Any one who will take the trouble to visit White Salmon and Bingen will soon discover that our neighbors are far from being asleep and that a development is taking place in them that is at present having no parallel along the Columbia river. Three years ago White Salmon consisted of one or two dwelling houses and a store. Today it has a population of 600 or 800 and has business establishments that most any town need not be ashamed of. The greatest development has taken place in the past year and a half, or since the announcement that the Portland and Seattle railroad would be built. It now has stores of every description, one of which last year did a business of \$58,000; three hotels, modern in every respect, two banking establishments, newspaper, churches, a school in which there are over 100 pupils enrolled with four large well equipped school rooms and four teachers. During the year just closed many buildings have been erected, among them the one by the Odd Fellows, which has two large stores on the ground floor and a fine lodge hall on the second and is supplied with everything needed in the way of holding lodge meetings or entertaining, including a kitchen. Two other business places are not in process of erection and plans for another on the corner opposite the White Salmon Valley bank are being considered. In the largest of the buildings which is being constructed a theatre, equipped with all the adjuncts necessary for the production of the average play has been arranged for. One of the most important events for White Salmon was the formation recently of a Commercial club. This organization has taken up the work of advertising the country and is issuing attractive literature telling of the advantages of climate and soil. Among the possibilities at White Salmon are an electric road to Front Lake and a box factory. A company to build the road has been incorporated and a preliminary survey made. Stock has been taken in it, and it is understood that if the plan is feasible that capital for its construction can be secured. At a meeting which was held a few days ago a proposition to erect a box factory was discussed and favorably considered. Fruit growers are looking forward to the time when they will ship their apples and strawberries out by train and are figuring on the manufacture of their own boxes. Although White Salmon has been very successful in raising fruit without irrigation land owners and growers there have come to the conclusion that it can be improved with the use of water and have organized a ditch company for that purpose. An expert engineer will be employed to go over the ground and devise the best plan for constructing the ditch and it is expected that work will be commenced this summer. Bonds will be issued to provide the capital necessary for the enterprise and the acreage to be irrigated will be close to 2,000.

It is also rumored that he will erect a fine house at Bingen and reside there. The railroad company property is 22 feet wide at Bingen, but it is claimed that the station will be built on land that has not yet been purchased for it. Among the sites that it is said to have in view is the hotel property belonging to Mrs. Hansen. The town has a most decided appearance that there is something doing and presents a far different aspect than it did a year ago.

New Postoffice Building.

A new ruling has been made by the postoffice department in regard to the date for notifying box renters when payment is due. The old plan was to place the notice cards in the boxes on the first of the month and if the rent was not paid by the 10th to declare the box vacant. The new ruling provides that cards must be placed in the boxes on the 20th of the month and if the rent is not paid by the 1st, to declare the box vacant and rent it. The next payment is due on the 1st of April, so that those holding boxes will be notified on March 20th.
