## DR. BLALOCK VISITS HOOD RIVER

Dr. Blalock, of Blalock Island, visited in Hood River last Wednesday and was the guest of Hon. E. I. Smith. The doctor is one of the most prominent horticulturists in the northwest. For a period of 10 years he was the honored president of the Oregon State Horticultural society, and during his incumbency proved a most efficient officer. Dr. Blalock was succeeded in office by our townsman the Hon. E. I. Smith.

At the present time the doctor is devoting his entire time and energy to the development of the resources of Blalock Island. This island is located a few miles above Arlington in the Columbia river, and possesses an area of 400 acres. Six hundred and forty acres of this territory is located on the Oregon side and the remainder on the Washington side. In its present stage of development the doctor has 40 acres in orchard which is set principally to peaches and apricots which have proven a very profitable crop for that locality. The situation of the island is character of the soil are conducive to early vegetation.

In addition to his large orchard he has at the present time 500 acres in alfalfa, and is now making arrangements to sow 3000 additional acres. When this field has been sown it will be the largest alfalfa field in the west and we believe in the United States.

The crops are irrigated by a pumping system which binds its source in the Columbia river. The water is pumped up from the river by a new and economical system known as the "Gas Producing System." This plant will supply an abundance of water for his entire tract.

Dr. Blalock intends to stock his farm with the very best of hogs, and at the present time has 250 head of the finest thoroughbred Berkshires obtainable. These hogs are all registered stock, and the doctor expects to breed several thousand head from them with which to consume his vast acreage of alfalfa pasture.

When asked how he enjoyed his trip to Hood River, and what he thought of our country, he replied: "This has been a revelation to me. I have heard so much about this valley and its fruit industry, but what I have seen today far surpassed the most favorable impressions that I had of this territory. I am of the opinion that you who are resident here do not fully realize the future possibilities of your fruit industry. In a few years, when all of these young orchards are in bearing, the revenues obtained therefrom will exceed the fondest dreams of the most hopeful settler."

The doctor was driven over the valley by Mr. Smith, who took him to many points of interest and explained to him the methods pursued in the culture of the orchards. The doctor left for Portland Wednesday possessed with a new inspiration and zeal for the occupation of the horticulturist.
