The foregoing list was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Text Book Commission, composed of H. W. Scott, P. L. Campbell, W. M. Colvig, C. A. Jones and M. A. Miller. The commission had been holding private sessions for three days. Friday afternoon they held a public session, called the roll on each subject, and each commissioner announced his choice.

Before the vote was taken the chairman, H. W. Scott, briefly addressed the assembled representatives of the

publishing houses, explaining to them that the members of the commission had each his own opinions as to the merits of the books, and that after discussion and study of the books, they had adjusted their differences so as to agree unanimously upon the list to be selected.

The selection was of course disappointing to those text book men who did not succeed in getting a share of the awards, but there were no complaints heard after the result was announced.
