# forests is 156,000,000 acres, but stock is not pastured on all of them. In one region cattle and horses predominate, in another sheep and goats. During the year just closed the report shows that 23,662 applications for pasture were approved, and of

port shows that 23,662 applications for pasture were approved, and of these applicants 21,788 paid the fees and were granted permits. This was 92 per cent. Last year there were 18,-010 applications and 16,593 permits, exactly the same percentage.

The increase in the number of stock on the ranges for this year is due almost entirely to the increased area of the range, and does not mean that the pastures are crowded this year more than last, according to officials more than last, according to officials of the forest service. The total area of the forest is several million acres more this year, and a greater number of stock can be accommodated with-

out an increase per acre.

Many stockmen living on the borders of the forests have ranges of their own, located, however, in such a way that it is necessary to cross the forest to get to it. These owners are permitted to send their stock through the forests without charge, but on permit. This year 833 permits were granted, for 36,807 horses and cattle and 2,051,830 sheep and goats, a substantial increase over the preceding year. out an increase per acre.
