

HOOD RIVER APPLES FOR THE ORIENT

Ivy L. Lee, publicity agent of the Harriman lines, writes as follows:

Six hundred boxes of the finest apples grown in the Hood River valley have started this week on a ten thousand mile journey to Vladivostok, Siberia.

Carefully wrapped, packed and boxed this fruit is expected to reach its remote destination via Puget sound, Vancouver and Japan, in perfect condition. It is probable that no other fruit product of American orchards is shipped so great a distance.

No orchardist is allowed to pack his own apples even if he wants to do so. The apple growers union attends to that and their men are under orders to reject all fruit that shows the slightest blemish.

So great is the care exercised by the Hood River growers, however, that 20 acres is considered to be as much one orchardist can look after properly.

But the returns per acre are so large that there is no complaint in regard to the income derived, which runs above \$10,000 a year from these small tracts.

Men who arrived a few years ago with but a few hundred dollars and now own orchards valued at \$50,000 are numerous.
