Oppose Infected Fruit Law.

The Idaho State Horticultural society, at its annual meeting at Payette, has the subject of the sale of wormy or infected fruit before it in an interesting manner. The state law provides that no such fruit shall be sold except for immediate manufacture into by-products. This law, enacted a year ago, is bitterly opposed by a class of fruit growers, but is sustained by most of the leaders in the business. The objectors claim they should enjoy perfect liberty in disposing of their product of whatever quality. Judge Fremont Wood, president of the Association and the foremost apple grower of the state, raised the issue in his annual address, anticipating the objections and inviting those to fight the matter out. He took strong grounds in support of the law.

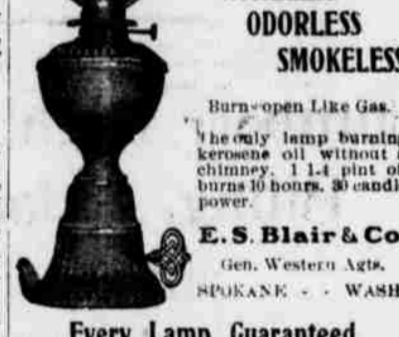

Special Election Notice.

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the city of Hood River on the 17th day of February, 1908, at which the qualified voters of said city will vote upon the question of whether said city shall issue bonds upon the credit of the city in the sum of \$40,000 for the purchase of the complete system of water owned by the Hood River Electric

Light Power & Water Co., at a price not to exceed \$40,000 and for the creation of a fund of \$10,000, to be used, or so much thereof as may be necessary, in improving said water system by the city of Hood River, and in reimbursing said city in the sum of \$500, for moneys expended by it in the purchase of the Tucker spring; said bonds to be of denominations of from \$100 to \$1000, as the purchaser may desire, payable twenty years after date, with interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum, with interest coupons attached thereto, and in all respects issued in accordance with section 122 of the Charter of Hood River. Said election will be held in the city hall in the city of Hood River. The polls will be opened at 8 o'clock a. m. on the date of the said election, and be kept open continuously until seven o'clock p. m. of said day.
