

ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 139. An ordinance providing for the construction and laying down of all necessary sewers to provide a system of sewers for Division Nine of the Sewer District of the City of Hood River, Oregon.

Providing that the cost thereof shall be assessed against the property directly benefited by such sewers, and providing that the owners of such property may, at their option, pay the cost of the construction of said sewers, and providing the manner of giving notice of the time and place of such hearing.

The City of Hood River does ordain as follows: Section 1. It is hereby determined to construct and lay down all necessary sewers and drains of a character and capacity sufficient to provide a system of sewerage for Division Nine of the Sewer District of the City of Hood River, Oregon, and the same shall be located on the streets mentioned in Section 2 of this ordinance, and said sewers are hereby declared to constitute Section Nine of the Hood River sewer system and the same shall be referred to and known as Section Nine of said sewer system.

Section 2. That the whole cost of the construction and laying down of said sewer system shall be assessed against the property directly benefited thereby.

Section 3. That said sewer system shall be constructed upon and in the following named streets of the City of Hood River, Oregon. The same being more fully described as follows, to-wit:

(1) An outfall sewer in Sinclair street, from the center line of block three of Blowers lot addition to the City of Hood River, extended easterly, to and connecting with manhole in Section One of said sewer system, which said manhole is located upon the intersection of Sinclair and Viola streets.

(2) A sewer beginning at the point of commencement of said outfall sewer as above described and running thence southerly on a line 5 feet westerly from and parallel with the center line of Sinclair street to a manhole to be located 10 feet north of the center line of May street.

(3) A sewer on May street beginning at manhole last above described and running thence westerly to a manhole to be located at the intersection of the south line of May street with a line 10 feet westerly from and parallel with the center line of Stranahan avenue.

(4) A sewer on Stranahan avenue beginning at the manhole above last described and running southerly upon a line 10 feet westerly from and parallel with the center line of Stranahan avenue to a manhole to be located at the intersection of the center line of Pine street extended westerly.

(5) A sewer on the center line of the alley running north and south through the centers of blocks two, three and four of Stranahan's first addition to the City of Hood River, beginning at the center line of block two of said addition and running northerly to a manhole to be located upon the center line of Taylor street.

(6) A sewer on Taylor street from the manhole above last described running easterly along the center line of Taylor street to a manhole to be located at point of intersection with sewer on Stranahan avenue above described.

(7) A sewer on the center line of Pine street from the west line of G street to the southerly end of the sewer on Stranahan avenue above described.

(8) A sewer on the center line of June street from the west line of F street running easterly along the center line of June street to a manhole to be located at point of intersection with sewer on Stranahan avenue above described.

(9) A sewer on May street on a line 10 feet northerly from and parallel with the center line of May street, beginning at the westerly line of G street and running westerly to the manhole at the southerly end of sewer on Sinclair street above described.

(10) A sewer on Mildred street on a line 10 feet more or less northerly from and parallel with the center line of Mildred street beginning at the west line of St. Marys street and running westerly to a manhole to be located at intersection with the sewer on Sinclair street above described.

(11) A sewer on Lovina street on a line 10 feet more or less northerly from and parallel with the center line of Lovina street, beginning at a manhole to be located at intersection with the sewer on Sinclair street above described and running easterly to and connecting with the manhole upon the line of the sewer in Sinclair street located at the westerly end of the sewer in Mildred street above described.

(12) A sewer on May street on a line 10 feet northerly from and parallel with the center line of May street, beginning at a point about 30 feet westerly from the west line of Sinclair and running westerly to a manhole to be located at a point 10 feet westerly from the center line of Paradise avenue.

(13) A sewer on Paradise avenue on a line 10 feet westerly from and parallel with the center line of Paradise avenue, beginning at the manhole above last described and running northerly to a manhole to be located upon the center line of Manrice street extended westerly.

(14) An outfall sewer being an extension of the sewer above last described and beginning at the manhole above last described and running northerly to a manhole to be located at intersection with the south line of State street and running from thence in a north-westerly direction upon a direct line to a point of intersection with the sewer in State street, which said manhole sewer is a portion of Section One of said sewer system; said point of intersection with State street sewer being located at a proper and convenient point east of the terminal flush-tank of said State street sewer.

Section 4. Said sewer system shall be constructed and laid down in accordance with the plans and specifications thereof prepared by P. M. Hall-Lewis, civil engineer, which said plans and specifications and an estimate of the probable cost of said section of said sewer system and any of the plan showing the design for said section, prepared from a survey thereof made in September, 1907, by P. M. Hall-Lewis, civil engineer, have been filed with the recorder of Hood River, Oregon, reference to which is hereby made for a more complete description of the exact location of said section of sewer system and of the points of connection of the several branches thereof, and the manner of construction and other particulars also as therein.

Section 5. A standing committee on sewers consisting of A. D. Moe, E.

S. Mayo and E. O. Blanchard, or their successors in office, are hereby designated and appointed a special committee of the council whose duty it shall be to view the streets and location of said proposed section of said sewer system and to ascertain and determine what property is directly benefited by such section of said sewer system and the extent and portion of such benefits to be allocated to each lot and upon such lot, part of lot or acreage property, so directly to be benefited, and report the same to council in writing as soon as the same can conveniently be done.

Upon the report, provided for in this section, being filed with the recorder, he shall, without further direction from the council, give notice thereof by posting notices thereof in three public places in the City of Hood River, Oregon, for a period of 10 days, which notices must specify with convenient certainty the streets or parts thereof on which said section of said sewer system is proposed to be located, and the property to be benefited and determined by said committee to be directly benefited by said section of said sewer system, the extent and portion of such benefits, all of which shall be shown by a certificate filed in the office of the recorder, and further, that if any notices of said committee, if any, to the council, and that the council will thereupon consider said report and objections thereto, if any, and that all persons interested may appear at said meeting of the council and be heard by the council concerning the property directly benefited by said section of said sewer system, and the extent and portion of said benefit and the amount of the assessment upon each lot, part of lot or acreage property, so directly benefited by said section of said sewer system, and that said hearing will be continued from time to time if necessary until parties interested shall have been fully heard in relation thereto.

Section 6. The notice provided for in the last two preceding sections of this ordinance shall be deemed full, complete and sufficient notice to all interested parties of their right to appear and be heard in relation to the matters mentioned in this ordinance.

Grown Oranges in Josephine County. The fact that there has been hardly any frost thus far this season has caused much comment from newcomers and they have some trouble in believing that this is the winter season.

One of the results will be that an experiment of much importance to be tried by A. M. Cherry, on his place, six miles above Merlin, in the Jump-off-Joe country. He is having good success with his fruit growing and now proposes growing oranges, as he finds that he is in the latitude of the orange belt, some 1800 feet above sea level. The soil seems very well adapted for the growing of citrus fruits. It has a limestone and porphyry soil, which is highly fertile and exceptionally desirable for the production of the fruit.

Mr. Cherry is one time resided in California, where he was engaged in the growing of oranges, and he confidently expects to succeed in growing the golden spheres in this climate.

Manager Chas. Messerve, for the Grants Pass Fruit Growers' Association, has sent to the Agricultural Department for information regarding the new orange which has been developed for the climate like this, which are of a harder growth and are now being successfully cultivated in many such regions as this - Grants Pass Courier.

Planting More Orchards. Portland, Jan. 16. - After marketing the most profitable fruit crop ever produced in the state, Rogue River growers have begun the planting of apple, pear and peach trees on a scale that will double the crop of this section. The record-breaking prices paid in eastern markets for Oregon fruit is responsible for the planting of 7000 acres with a half a million trees this winter. Only about 1000 acres of orchards were set out last year and the estimated total of new trees, 225,000 are pear, 175,000 apple and 100,000 peach trees. At the bearing stage these trees in one season would produce a crop worth \$5,000,000, if the growers received only \$1 a bushel, which is far below the prevailing prices for Oregon fruit.

By keeping up the reputation of its output to the highest mark the apples and pears grown in the Rogue River section are commanding the highest prices in home and foreign markets.
