

ANTI-PASS LAW TO BE AMENDED

Senator Clapp, of Minnesota, is the first member of either house to attempt, in all seriousness, to amend the anti-pass section of the Hepburn law. He is very much in favor of the amendment which he proposed and says he believes it will become law at this session of congress. He has back of him a large number of the bill which will be introduced, and it is likewise favored by the railway managers; so, I do not look for serious opposition to it.

ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 142

An ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to amend section 23 of Ordinance No. 7, entitled, "An ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades or callings, and regulating the manner of issuing licenses," as amended by ordinances Nos. 16 and 18 of said city, and the City of Hood River does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That section 23 of Ordinance No. 7, entitled, "An ordinance to impose and regulate licenses upon certain trades or callings, and regulating the manner of issuing licenses," as amended by Ordinance No. 16 and Ordinance No. 18 of said city, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2. Every person or persons, firm, corporation, who owns or keeps any horse or horses, animal or animals, team or teams, automobile, motorcar, or other vehicle, which shall be used upon the streets, alleys or public highways within the corporate limits of the City of Hood River, to convey any person or persons, article, substance, property or thing, or to do any work for, or render any service to any person or persons, firm or corporation, for hire or any valuable consideration whatever, other than for the owner or owners thereof, or for the City of Hood River, or for planting or cultivating gardens, or which shall be used exclusively for the burial of the dead or for hospital purposes shall pay an annual license fee of \$30, for one team, automobile, motor car, or other vehicle as used; \$30 for two teams, automobiles, motor cars, or other vehicles so used; \$40 for three teams, automobiles, motor cars, or other vehicles so used, and \$50 for four or more teams, automobiles, or other vehicles so used. The license provided for in this section shall be paid annually in advance.

All licenses heretofore granted to any of the persons mentioned in this section shall continue in force and effect until their expiration.

Ordinance No. 141

An ordinance entitled to provide for the transfer or assignment of licenses for the sale of spirituous, vinous or malt liquors in quantities less than one gallon in the City of Hood River, to the holders of such licenses.

The City of Hood River does ordain as follows: Section 1. Whenever any person holding a license to sell spirituous, vinous or malt liquors in quantities less than one gallon in the City of Hood River, desires to transfer or assign the same, the common council may authorize such transfer or assignment upon the holder of such license and his assignee complying with the conditions hereinafter imposed.

Section 2. The holder of such license as aforesaid shall make application to the common council in writing for authority to transfer or assign the same, stating therein the name of his proposed assignee and the unexpired time for which said license has to run; the person to whom such license is proposed to be transferred or assigned shall make and file a good and sufficient bond with the recorder of the City of Hood River in the penal sum of \$1,000.00, before the council shall permit such license to be assigned, which bond shall be conditioned and executed in all respects as required by Section 3 of Ordinance No. 110 of the City of Hood River, and such person shall also obtain the signatures of an actual majority of the legal voters in said city, to a petition to the common council, praying that such license be assigned, transferred, or assigned, all of which shall be done at the expense of the petitioner, and without expense to the City of Hood River; the sufficiency of said petition shall be determined by the requirements of Section 4 of Ordinance No. 110 aforesaid; such person shall also make and file his affidavit with the recorder of the City of Hood River to the effect that he has not been convicted of selling intoxicating liquors to any minor within one year from the date thereof; and further that he has not been convicted within one year from the date of such affidavit of the violation of any of the provisions of Ordinance No. 110 of said city. The granting of such petition as aforesaid by the common council shall not be deemed the issuing of a license for a less period than one year, as provided by Section 2 of Ordinance No. 111.

Section 3. Upon the compliance with all the conditions heretofore imposed by this ordinance upon the holder of such license, and his proposed assignee, the common council may authorize such transfer or assignment, as prayed for; provided, however, that no holder of any license as aforesaid, shall be authorized or permitted by the common council of the City of Hood River, to transfer or assign his license during the pendency of any criminal prosecution against him by the City of Hood River, for the violation of any

of the provisions of Ordinance No. 110 of said city, nor after his conviction on any such charge; and provided further, that no transfer or assignment of any such license shall be authorized, sanctioned or permitted to any of the persons enumerated in Section 1 of Ordinance No. 110 of said city. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to permit any person to transfer any liquor license granted by the common council of the City of Hood River, to any other place or building in said city, than that named in the original petition for such license. ORDINANCE NO. 140. An ordinance providing for the grading of Pine street from the center line of A street of the Town of Parkhurst, now an addition to the City of Hood River, now Third street, in the City of Hood River, to the center line of Stranahan Avenue, otherwise known as county road, now Twelfth street in the City of Hood River, upon the grade as established by Ordinance No. 122 passed by the Common Council of the City of Hood River, on the 6th day of May, 1907.

THE CITY OF HOOD RIVER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. It is hereby determined to grade Pine street to a width of thirty feet, and from the center line of A street, now Third street, in the Town of Parkhurst, now an addition to the City of Hood River, upon the grade as established by Ordinance No. 122, to the center line of Stranahan Avenue, otherwise known as county road, now Twelfth street in the City of Hood River.

Section 2. The grading of said Pine street, hereby determined to be made, shall be done and completed on or before the first day of May A. D., 1908.

Section 3. The Street Committee is hereby authorized and directed to get the estimates and specifications for the work to be done hereunder on said Pine street in duplicate and to file the original of such estimate and specifications to be filed in the office of the City Recorder and the duplicate thereof to be filed in the office of the Street Commissioner.

Section 4. After such estimates and specifications have been received and filed as directed in Section 3 of this Ordinance, said grading and improvement on said Pine street in the City of Hood River, shall be done and completed in accordance with Ordinance No. 144, entitled:

"An ordinance providing for the improvement of streets and alleys in the City of Hood River by the city and further providing for the improvement of said streets by the property owners."

Said ordinance having been passed by the Common Council of the City of Hood River on the 6th day of January A. D., 1908, and was approved by Mayor on the 11th day of January A. D., 1908.
