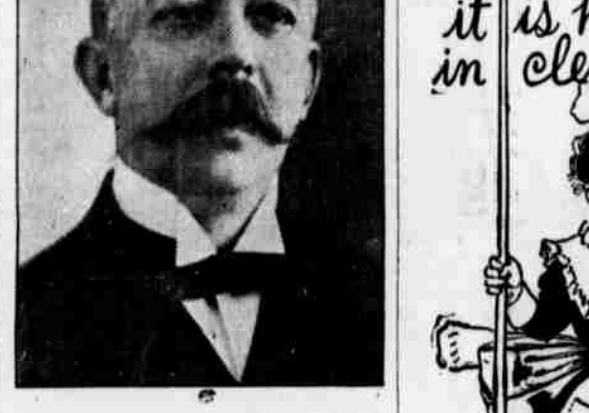
Elmer Root and Ira Evans took the road grader back to The Dalles Saturday, after working about a week fixing our roads.

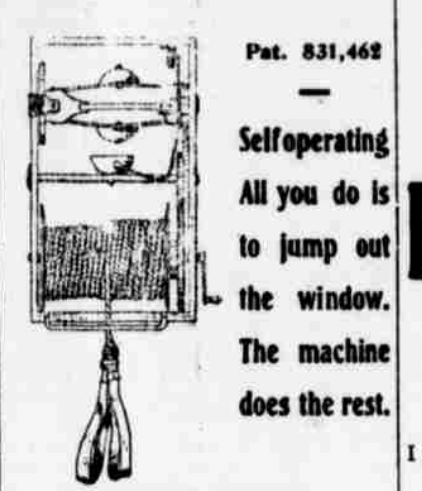
