

CHERRY CARNIVAL AT THE DALLES

The mid-summer meeting of the State Horticultural Society and Cherry Fair will be held at The Dalles, Oregon, on June 30, July 1 and 2.

Following are the prizes offered by The Dalles business men to exhibitors: ONE BOX EXHIBIT.

Royal Ann—10-pound box, first prize, cup, value, \$10. Second prize, cash, value, \$3. Third prize, cash, value, \$2.

Black Republican—Five 10-pound boxes, first prize, cup, value, \$15. Second prize, cash, value, \$5. Third prize, cash, value, \$3.

General exhibit 15 or more 10-pound boxes not less than three varieties: First prize, cash, \$25; second prize, cash, \$15; third prize, cash, \$10.

All fruit entered for premium must be grown by exhibitor.

An attractive program consisting of speeches, music, vocal and instrumental, is being arranged and will be published in a short time.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Never-Falling Sponge Cake. (Kindness Mrs. A. M. H.)

Beat three eggs five minutes, add one and one-half cups sugar, beat five minutes more and stir in one cup flour sifted with one teaspoonful baking powder, one cup boiling water.

Philadelphia Scapple. Boil a cleaned pig's head until the flesh slips easily from the bones.

Cleaning White Leghorn Hats. Can you tell me how to clean a white leghorn hat without spoiling it?

Home-Made Sausage. Six pounds of lean fresh pork and three of fat ground together in a meat chopper.

Hard Times Cake. Try this for a hard times cake: One and one-half cups of sugar, one cup of sour milk or hot water, one teaspoonful of soda, one teaspoonful of cinnamon and cloves, three scant cups of flour, one-half cup of butter or lard.

Old-Fashioned Dyes. Old-fashioned dyes were called for and nobody responded, so I will contribute mine, which were used in our family for over 40 years, and have been satisfactory.

Orange for Cotton. Dip them in the yellow dye; make a strong lime water by slacking lime in hot water, let it settle, pour off the clear water, put your rags into the lime water over night, or till changed to orange.

Green for Cotton. First dip your rags in the yellow dye, then in the blue. Rinse and air them. Dip again in the yellow and then in the blue, and so on until you have the desired shade.

Blue for Cotton. Two ounces prussiate potash; one

tablespoonful of copperas in two gallons of warm water; one tablespoonful of oil of vitriol. Put your rags into the dye, wring them and dip them again till you have the desired shade.

Yellow for Cotton. One half pound of sugar of lead dissolved in half a pail of hot water; six ounces of bichromate of potash, dissolved in one-half pail of cold water. When dissolved heat both. Dip your rags into the lead, then into the potash, and so on till you have the desired shade. Rinse well and hang in the air to dry.—Old Fashioned House-keeper

To Wash Woolen Stockings. To wash woolen hose for children: I have used a nice white soap and after washing through the first water about the temperature one would use for washing hair, have the rinsing water about the same and lather thoroughly again, never rinsing the soap out. It leaves them soft and they do not shrink. The first stockings my baby had shrank in the first washing so she could hardly wear them, and now I never have any trouble at all.

Campbor for Moths. I saw in your column a recommendation that wood alcohol and gum camphor could be used in case of bed-bugs and moths. The writer did not state how to use it or how much camphor to use.—A. W. J.

Crush an ounce of camphor and put it into a gallon of wood alcohol. Let it stand all night in the morning shake it hard, and with a syringe, inject it into every crack and crevice in the suspected room. Go over the furniture in the same way. Then shut the room up closely for eight or ten hours. For longer if you can spare it. Sweep and dust, and burn the stuff and dust.

For Shut-ins. I wonder if any of the shut-ins could use this? Cut the best pieces of old coats into oblong or square pieces.

Another version of the method brought forward by other housekeepers for sweetening lard and drippings. You mean, of course, that the sliced potatoes are put into the fat raw.
