### OREGON STATE NEWS IN BRIEF.

The organization of Company H, O. N. G., at Dallas, has been completed. G. D. Chorpeneing was unanimously chosen captain.

Corvallis has been selected as the next meeting place of the state encampment of the G. A. R., which concluded its session at Newport last week.

The name of the Heppner National forest has been changed by the department, and after July 1 will be officially known as the Umattila National forest. Headquarters will still be retained at Heppner.

Morrow county is the third county in the state in the yield of wheat and last year her output was immense. This year, at present indications, the crop will not be much more than half what it was last fall.

For the killing of Mrs. Edward Sam Gordon, at Marshfield, May 9, "Mazook" Anderson was found guilty last week of manslaughter. The jury was out 18 hours. Sentence of five years in the penitentiary was imposed.

A. A. Smith, a locomotive and station engineer, employed by the Bridal Veil Lumber Company at Bridal Veil, was instantly killed last week by an unexplained explosion of a donkey engine at the yards of the company.

John Smith, a hobo, was arrested at Hood River last week, and when searched by the police \$1000 was found on his person. Much of the money was in \$100 and \$50 bills and was rolled up and wadded into brass cartridge shells.

The Great Northern gold mine, located in the Blue River country, Linn county, which at one time promised to become the best paying property in Western Oregon, were sold last week at sheriff's sale for \$3875 to Colonel J. M. Williams of Eugene.
