## **NEW PACKING** LAW PROPOSED

WILL EFFECT THE ENTIRE COUNTRY

At the annual meeting of the International Apple Shippers Association will be picked up quick- which will be held this year, August 5th and 6th at Niagara Falls, one of packing and shipping will be brought has already been introduced in Congress by Representative Porter of New unqualified endorsement of the shippers association and growers as well. In speaking of it the Fruit Trade Journal says that it "provides for standard grading as well as standard packages, and will apply over the entire United States. This is a measure of far greater importance than any thing which has ever been undertaken in the way of legislation affecting apple packing, and thus far there seems to be little objection to it on the part of growers or shippers, while all operators are saturally in favor it. It will come before the fall session of Congress, and while it can hardly become operative during the coming apple sseason there is every prospect of its passage, if strongly supported by those interested, and it will be in effect next year"
