

DESTROYED 2,000 BUSHELS OF WHEAT

A fire which originated from coal from a threshing engine destroyed 2,000 bushels of wheat near Boyd, Ore., last Thursday. An account of the fire, and how it occurred, taken from The Dalles Chronicle, says that the threshing engine was in the field on the morning of the 21st of August, and about 5 o'clock on the farm of Dick Neal the grain had been placed in sacks beside the straw stack. In cleaning the engine a few live coals were thrown out by the operator and the Neal farm noticed them. Soon after, however, the big pile of grain sacks were observed to be afire, having been ignited from the coals.

The threshers had no means of preventing the spreading of the blaze and soon all the sacks were enveloped in flames. Dufur was immediately communicated with. J. G. Helmrich, general manager of the Great Southern road, was in Dufur at the time the news of the fire was received there. Under his orders an engine was ordered out and in charge of Conductor J. D. Tobin a coachload of men and boys was carried to the scene of the conflagration. The chemical apparatus of the Dufur fire department was also taken in the coach, this being the only means the men had of fighting the flames.

While the fire burned over all of the sacks, it was extinguished after it had consumed about one half of the grain. In all there were about 150 men and boys at the scene of the fire fighting the flames.

Nathan Wheeland left this afternoon for Dufur to adjust the loss of the fire. Mr. Neal's grain crop having been covered by insurance.
