Notice to Stockholders of Farmers' Irrigating Company.

The annual meeting of the Stockholders of the Farmers' Irrigating Company will be held at the K. of P. Hall, up stairs, Saturday, October 3rd, 1908, at 10 a. m. All Stockholders are urged to be present; important business will come before said meeting.

Notice to Stockholders of the By-Laws of the Farmers' Irrigating Company. The following Amendment to the By-Laws of the Farmers' Irrigating Company were approved by the Board of Directors, and directed by them to be submitted to the Stockholders for their approval or rejection at the regular annual meeting of the Stockholders of the By-Laws of the Farmers' Irrigating Company to be held on the 10th day of October, 1908:

ARTICLE VII. The annual meeting of the Stockholders shall be held at the K. of P. Hall, up stairs, in Hood River, Oregon, on the first Saturday in September in each year, and the Secretary shall cause a notice of such annual meeting to be published in one or more of the County papers, or such other newspaper published in Hood River County, so that the Directors may determine, for not less than three months in advance, the date of the meeting of the Stockholders.

ARTICLE VI. The Board of Directors shall consist of seven members, always including the President and Vice-President, four of which members shall be chosen at the first annual meeting after the adoption of this By-Law, for a term of two years, and three for a term of one year; at the second annual election after the adoption of this By-Law three directors shall be chosen for a term of two years, and thereafter each class of directors shall be chosen for a term of two years at the expiration of their term of office.

ARTICLE VII. At all stockholders meetings stockholders may be represented by proxy, which must be in writing, and filed with the Secretary of the meeting provided, that proxy shall be held and voted by a stockholder in person, and not otherwise provided, further, that no stockholder shall vote a greater number of shares by proxy than the number of shares owned by said stockholder.
