

Want Coyote Bounty Law

A bounty of from \$1 to \$1.50 per coyote will be asked of the legislature of this state when it convenes this winter and the request will be backed up by not only the sheepmen of eastern Oregon, but by those of the Willamette valley as well, for the bill pest is already creating great havoc among the flocks of the eastern part of the state.

It is estimated that the coyotes during the past year have done over \$1,000,000 damage to the flocks of the state, and the sheepmen believe that the only way to exterminate the pest is to provide a bounty to make their killing worth while.

In order to get the matter before the legislature the Oregon sheep commission in its annual report will embrace a recommendation of a bounty of \$1.50 to be paid for each animal killed. It will point to the success with which that plan combatted the evil some years ago.

The sheepmen of the state will also urge through their organization that such a bounty be given.

One half of the sum paid, according to the plan now under advisement, will be paid by the sheepmen through a special tax levied upon them for that purpose. This is in line with the old law.

Big Prices for Wenatchee Apples

Apples are getting to be a scarce article in the Wenatchee valley. Ranchers have sold their crops and the purchasers are holding for high prices. Apples that were selling two months ago for 80 cents a box are now selling at \$1.50 and \$1.75 a box. Winesaps are selling for \$2.25 and \$2.50 a box, and Spitzbergen are commanding about the same figures. \$1.75 is the amount for Jonathans and \$1.50 and \$1.60 for Grimes Golden.

Interest has been taken in extending the market for Wenatchee apples. The reports on the shipments made to Australia, China, England and Germany are being awaited.

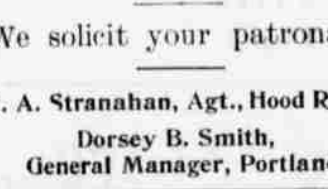
