White Salmon to Issue \$60,000 Bonds

A dispatch to the Oregonian from White Salmon states that two important events took place which mark a new era for the town and valley. One was the favorable vote on the organization of an irrigation district, with a \$60,000 bond. The three directors are John B. Humphrey, Rudolph Lauterbach and John Meyers. The plan is to pump water from the White Salmon river, sufficient to irrigate 1000 or more acres. Work on the project will begin immediately. The other event was the incorporation of the White Salmon Valley Growers' Fruit Union, a stock company, capitalized at \$5000. The union purpose to build a cold storage plant, to buy and sell farm produce, to establish a cannery and to operate fruit lands for themselves and for others. The stock has already been subscribed. The union intends to begin operations very soon on its storage plant.

This bustling fruit town is forging ahead at a rapid rate, the postoffice receipts have increased nearly 50 per cent in the last six months. A high school, with a two year course, has been organized this year. The grammar departments are in an overcrowded condition. A new school building will be required very soon to accommodate the growing population. Strangers are continually amazed at the volume of business which is done in this town.

White Salmon Grants Light Franchise. The Husum Electric Light and Power company has received a franchise from White Salmon and will furnish that city with electric lights.

Martin Thompson and John Thompson, of The Dalles, are bringing the work on their canal at White Salmon Falls at Ilwaco to a completion. The concrete work will be finished today and workmen are beginning on the saw mill to be erected there by the Husum Power company.

The company intends some time to build a floating mill at White Salmon or Bingen, and an electric railway route has already been surveyed from White Salmon to Trout Lake.

There are vast forests of the finest kind of white pine, yellow pine, fir and larch timber that will be eventually brought out by railway from the foothills of Mt. Adams.

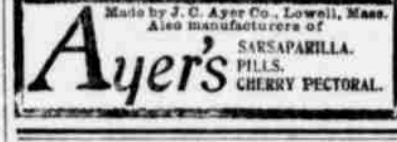
