

Returned from Visit Fast

J. H. Fredrick, the O. R. & N. agent at Hood River, who obtained a three months' leave of absence, returned here this week and will resume his duties. While away Mr. Fredrick visited in Pittsburg, his old home and also took in Washington, Baltimore and New York. On his way back he stopped off at Chicago and Kansas City. At Wichita, Kan., he intended to make a short stay, but on sighting from the train discovered that there was 250 cases of smallpox there and had no time in hopping back on the cars. While in Pennsylvania he learned that the Pittsburg and Allegheny mountain section was experiencing the worst drouth that had ever been known there. Navigation in the rivers at Pittsburg was closed owing to the drouth, something that had never been known before and the big steel and other manufacturing plants were unable to operate owing to the scarcity of water. The drouth occasioned an epidemic of typhoid fever and other diseases and one town in which a fire started was destroyed on account of a lack of water to prevent its spread. He states that he found many who were interested in Oregon and Hood River and will send away a bunch of literature descriptive of the valley.

Nations Honor Seaman.

Following the special delegate of President Roosevelt, diplomats personally representing the sovereigns of Germany, Great Britain, Italy and Denmark will formally proffer autographed portraits of their rulers to the new Seaman's Institute in New York City December 12th. Leading German, Italian, English and Danish citizens of the country together with representatives of various religious denominations and civic, philanthropic and shipping organizations will attend this international assembly. On Christmas day these portraits of Theodor Roosevelt, Kaiser Wilhelm II, King Edward, Victor Emmanuel III and Frederick III will be hung in the main hall of the modern hotel and club, where hundreds of sailors of every nationality have today begun to take up their shore home. "If I did not believe in missions to seamen, I would not be fit to be president of the United States," President Roosevelt recently told a representative of the American Seaman's Friend Society, of which he is a vice president. Similar expressions of approval of the society's work during the last eighty years for the seamen of every country on the globe have been made by the rulers of foreign nations in personally signing and sending their portraits to decorate the walls of the new headquarters for the 500,000 sailors who put in shore leave each year in this port. It will be recalled at these presentation exercises that Theodore Roosevelt as a boy of twelve began work for the benefit of sailors when he presented for the American Seaman's Friend Society one of its circulating ship's libraries to the outbound crew of the clipper ship "Eliza" on October 17, 1866.
