From 1882 to 1908 inclusive, the average rainfall, as compiled by Observer Charles Stewart, has been 17.68 inches, while for the 1st year it was but 12.02, 5.66 inches below the average. Previous to 1908 the low mark had been 13.08 inches, in 1898.
