The horticultural bureau of agriculture reports a steady decrease in the production of eastern apples. It says that every year "thousands of eastern orchards are abandoned to San Jose scale, to the codling moth, to the myriad other pests that prey upon the apple. Each year the irost ruins a large percentage of the cop. The modern commercial orchard, scientifically managed, is almost unknown in many orchard sections that in years gone by produced tremendons crops."

This can be and no doubt will be remedied somewhat, but nowhere are there such i deal conditions for producing first class apples as in Oregon.

for more than 40 years. Nor do the oldest Rock Creek Indiau know any thing about this cave.

W. P. Rauch volunteered to lead the first exploring party of 20 Chifs citizens to this wonderful cave of a few days ago, and since that tine every body wants to see it.
