John S. Glinther. John S. Glinther died July 9, 1909, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. H. Thompson, in Hood River, aged 78 years. He was stricken with paralysis but a few days before his death, from which he did not rally.

The deceased was born in Ohio, March 8, 1831, and came to Hood River less than a year ago from Iowa with his daughter. He leaves a family of five children, three having died and their mother some years ago. There are also five members of the family living: O. E. Glinther, of Hill City, Kans.; Mrs. Mariada Earnestine, Pasadena, Calif.; Mrs. Rose Mead, Crofton, Neb.; Frank Glinther, Hood River, and his daughter, Mrs. H. Thompson, above mentioned. Mr. Glinther lived for the most part of his life in Iowa where a large circle of friends reside. Two brothers and three sisters lament his death and severally reside in Minn., Neb., Iowa, Mo., and Virginia.

The funeral services were conducted by Revs. W. C. Gilmore and Nathan Evans. Besides the families of H. Thompson and Frank Glinther, Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Darling, of Underwood, and a number of friends were present. The I. O. O. F. and Rebekah lodges were represented and followed the remains to Idiewild cemetery where they were laid to rest.

Snake Common in Hood River. The report from Portland to the effect that a new species of snake has been found there which has a stinger in its tail, has caused a good deal of comment over the state, and no one has been able to name it. George Prather says that the snake is one which used to be commonly seen here along Indian Creek, and last week he killed one on his place two miles west of Tucker's bridge. He says that the snake was called the double headed snake, as it appeared to have two heads, or rather what would seem to be the tail has a small head shaped button, with an opening in it which might be taken for a mouth or a sheath for a stinger. The snake is sluggish, more like an eel, and grows from twelve to eighteen inches in length. It is usually found under a rotten limb or rock.

Rude Ranch Sold. Husum, Wash., July 12.—The M. Rude ranch of 100 acres, located in the central portion of the country, was recently purchased by N. B. Brooks for \$2400. The 80 acre ranch of Charles Day in the same locality was sold to L. Jacobs for \$1800. Ed. Pike purchased the 120 acre ranch of C. C. Miller in the 6 country for \$4800.

Will Have Bumper Wheat Crop. Portland, July 13.—Estimates of the year's wheat crop in the Pacific Northwest fix the probable yield at about 55,000,000 bushels, an increase by 15,000,000 over last year. This figure may not be reached if unfavorable conditions at harvest set in with normal weather, it is believed the yield will be large. Recent rains have been of immense benefit to the growing crop. Districts where the grain was practically given up because of the continued drought have taken heart again and the wheat is filling out in fairly good shape. The value of the rains of the past week to the wheat crop is variously estimated at from \$1,000,000 to \$3,000,000. In creased acreage in many sections of the state makes up in the total yield for a short crop in some districts. As wheat is still sticking around the dollar mark, Oregon's big wheat crop will mean a great prosperity for this section of the United States during the coming year.
