

“WHO'S WHO” MAN SEES THE VALLEY

Samuel G. Blythe, Washington correspondent, short story writer, satirist and originator of the "Who's Who" character sketches of national figures in the "Saturday Evening Post" visited Hood River Saturday and gained a few pointers on apples and boosting. Mr. Blythe, who is one of the most prolific writers of the day, was formerly Washington correspondent for the New York World and was a president of the famous Grid-iron in the national capital. He is one of the principal contributors to the Post and writes many humorous sketches for the monthly magazines.

Mr. Blythe is at present making a tour of the west having come out through Canada and he expects to visit California on his return trip. He is gathering material for a series of typical western stories in which the "boosting" element in the western character will not doubt come in for its share of keen Blythe satire. He is also keeping his hand on the political pulse out this way and since leaving Seattle has been moving in the wake of President Taft.

While Mr. Blythe tells all the newspaper men that he can say nothing for publication, because he has to save all his impressions to write up himself, he did express himself as being delightfully impressed with Hood River and the valley of apples.

When he heard that there were no daily papers in Hood River he gave a word of warning to local newspaper men and told of going to Adrian, Mich., when he was only 17 years old and running a daily paper for just 30 days. He said, "At the end of that time they had me strung to a tree."

Mr. Blythe made a trip out into the valley and he met a number of local citizens while in town. He was introduced to Donald Briggs and it was a case of one of the champion writers for the Saturday Evening Post meeting one of the champion agents for that popular magazine.

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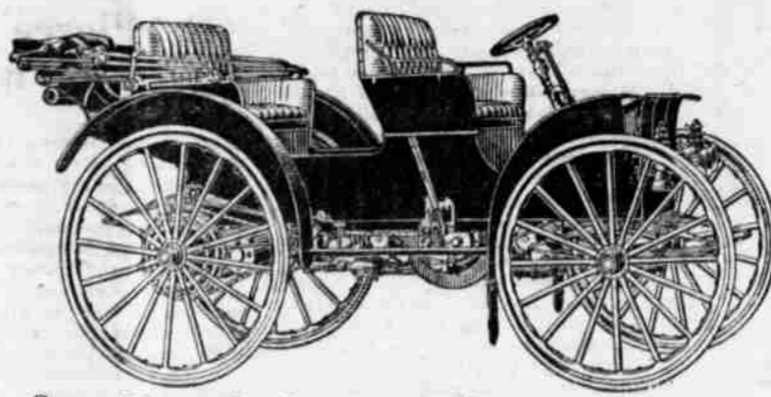
