Biggest Wagener Apple

Oscar Vanderbilt has put on exhibition in the window of Laraway's jewelry store a Wagener apple which he is willing to wager is the biggest of that variety ever grown. The apple measures 1 3/4 inches for one circumference and 1 1/2 inches for the other. It is unusual for the Wagener apples to reach a large size and this one was grown on a three year old tree. Mr. Vanderbilt has a number of others which he says are nearly as big as the one on exhibition, here and he is arranging to send them to Portland for the Chamber of Commerce display there.

\$1650 AN ACRE SETS NEW VALLEY RECORD

A new record was set for Hood River valley apple lands Saturday when ten acres was sold for \$1,650 per acre. The sale which was made by the Briggs-Ament Land Co., was the west half of the E. W. Redford place to Clyde E. Mason, of Chicago. Seven acres is in 8 year old trees and the remaining three acres is in 5 year olds. This not only gives the Briggs-Ament Co., the record for the highest price ever paid for land in the valley but they also hold the records which they made this season for 3 year old orchards and for unimproved lands. They recently made a sale of the former for \$1800 an acre and the latter for \$700 an acre. Mr. Mason recently came from Chicago with his wife and daughter and they will have their household goods forwarded immediately and make their home in the valley. Mr. Mason is a nephew of J. R. Shelton, of Grand Rapids, Mich., who recently bought a ranch in the valley.
