GROWERS UNIONS MAY CONSOLIDATE

Saturday at a meeting of some of be stockholders of the Fruit Growers Union, a movement was set on foot which will probably result in the consolidation of that organization with the Apple Growers' Unions. It was he regular annual meeting of the fruit union but there were not enough shares represented to make a qui rum. the members who were present, now-ever, met informally and passed a re-solution which recommended that the directors of the Union consuit with the directorate of the apple Union and tormulate a pien consolidating

the two associations.

The stock of the two Unions is argely held by the same growers' and it is not expected that there will be any difficulty in getting the stock bolders to ratify any agreement which the directors may arrange. Heretofore the two oragnizations have handled different crops in a similar lashion. The fruit growers have shipped strawberries, raspberries, black betries and cheriles while the upple growers have devoted their time to apples and pears. The consolidation of the two Unions would enable one organistzion to run more nearly the year around and many economies could be effected in the operation of the plants.

The two associations hold lesse adjoining one another slong the rail way here and boto have good ware houses while the apple growers operate a cold storage and use pisnt. In the event of consolidation the ground controlled by the Unions will all be needed to conduct their growing tuei
