GEOLOGIST TO AID GOOD-ROADS MEN

Professor H. M. Parks, head of the department of geology at the Oregon Agricultural College, has joined the Oregon "Good Roads" forces in a manner which, it is believed, will add great impetus to the work of that enthusiastic and enterprising organization.

During the next few months, Professor Parks and a number of his assistants will be engaged in the work of inspecting and testing the rock formation of practically all the important deposits in the Willamette Valley with a view of determining which of these formations will make the best material for improved highway. The investigation is to be the most thorough geological study that has ever been made in such a line in this state. When the data has been prepared, Professor Parks will issue the results of his work in the form of an official bulletin under the auspices of the O. A. C. The preliminary bulletin will embrace the results found in 12, and perhaps 14 counties in the western part of the state.

They will include the principal deposits in Clackamas, Multnomah, Marion, Lane, Linn, Benton, Polk, Yamhill, Washington, and Tillamook and probably Clatsop and Columbia. A second bulletin will be prepared later with reference to road materials found in Eastern Oregon, and still later the entire state will be covered. Professor Parks will do his work in conjunction with the general movement now in charge of Judge Lionel Webster.

"We shall tackle the Willamette Valley 'country first,'" explained Professor Parks today, "for the reason that there seems to be the most urgent need for improvement of highways in that general territory, not only because of its denser population and heavier traffic but also because of the general condition of the roads at the present time. There is no state in the Union which has as fine rock suitable for construction of the finest type of modern highways, and it is our purpose not only to report on these deposits, but to determine which will be the best as to quality and accessibility to the roads that need improvement first. Our work will then be broadened to take in the entire state."

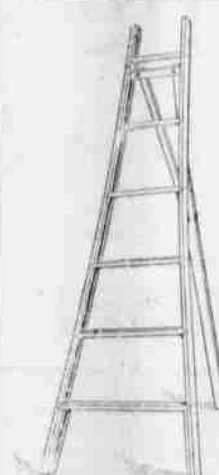

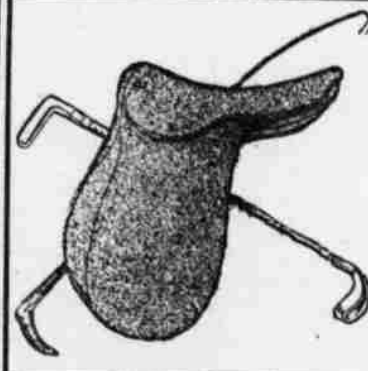
