VAN DEMAN AGAIN CHIEF JUDGE

Judges for the Third National Apple Show at Spokane, November 14-19 are: H. E. Van Deman, of Washington D.; C. J. W. Murphy, of Glenwood Iowa; C. J. Sinsell, of Boise, Idaho; S. A. Beach, of Ames, Iowa, and J. Gibb, of Kelowna, B. C.

The trustees of the show feel that they have been unusually fortunate in securing these judges. All of them are men of recognized ability and reputation as judges of fruit and particularly of apples. In accepting the position of judges of fruit these men make much of a sacrifice, but they are willing to do it for the good of the cause and growers can be assured of absolute fairness in the awards. The apple show trustees believe they have secured a jury equal to the one of 1909.

Prof. H. E. Van Deman, chief of the judges, is perhaps the best known to all. He is probably the foremost pomologist of the United States, and has been in exhibition work since 1884, when he was a judge at the Cotton Centennial in New Orleans. He judged the fruit at the Trans-Mississippi Exposition at Omaha; at the Pan-American Exposition, Buffalo; Lewis and Clark Exposition, Portland; Jamestown Exposition, Jamestown; Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition, Seattle; The 1909 Hood River Apple Fair; and a great number of minor fruit and apple shows all over the United States and Canada. He is a life member of the American Pomological Society and organized and conducted the division of Pomology in the United States department of Agriculture for many years. He is without question the greatest authority on fruit in America.

Rev. Dr. Ford to Study.

Rev. Dr. T. B. Ford, well-known throughout the Northwest as a minister of the Methodist Episcopal Church, is now residing at Sunnyside with his family. He was formerly pastor of the Methodist Church there and was stationed at Hood River last year. At the recent session of the Columbia River Conference, held at Spokane, he asked for a supernumerary relation and it was granted him, as he desires to make a special study of cardinal doctrines and subjects of his church.

"I am in excellent health and fully intend to preach again," said Rev. Dr. Ford yesterday. "I want to spend some time in special study on subjects that are engaging the minds of thinkers all over the world. Among these are the subjects of the incarnation, the atonement and the future life."—Oregonian.

Little, But, Oh My.

Oregon fruits are getting a foothold in the markets of the world, particularly our apples and pears, that will be rapidly extended. Those who think that the fruit business is being overdone do not consider that our best products are so sought after that we cannot now begin to supply the demand. The Hood River apple crop is, of course, small in comparison with the output of other districts, as Watsonville, Cal., where the annual output of apples is something like four thousand cars, or more than the entire production of Oregon, Washington and Idaho. But who ever heard of a Watsonville apple? But if Hood River produced twenty times as many apples as they do, the market would not be glutted, and they would bring three or four times as much as the Watsonville fruit. The fruit market will never be overdone if we do as Hood River and the Medford districts are doing—having the fruit perfect and pack it perfect.—Dales Optimist.


