

ALL METAL PICKING BUCKET INVENTED

An all-metal fruit picking bucket is the invention of Walter G. Palmer, of this city, and the new orchard utensil, working specimens of which are on exhibit at the office of the Hood River District Land company, bids fair to become very popular. It is a regular metal bucket, with a metal bottom of two sliding sections. The bottom slides from under the fruit in the filled buckets and it slides into the receptacle without jarring and bruising. The bucket according to Mr. Palmer is especially adapted to handling apples, pears, peaches and any small fruit or vegetables.

The Palmer Bucket company is the name of the corporation which has been formed by Mr. Palmer, J. Calvin Skinner, and Alfred T. Allen for the manufacture and sale of the new bucket. The company is incorporated for \$25,000 and the officers are Mr. Palmer, president; Mr. Skinner, vice-president; Mr. Allen, secretary and treasurer.

Let the bonds be sold at the earliest possible date and let us have a better and more adequate supply of water without delay, but let us also eliminate the personal animosities that are causing the delay and "quit ourselves like men."

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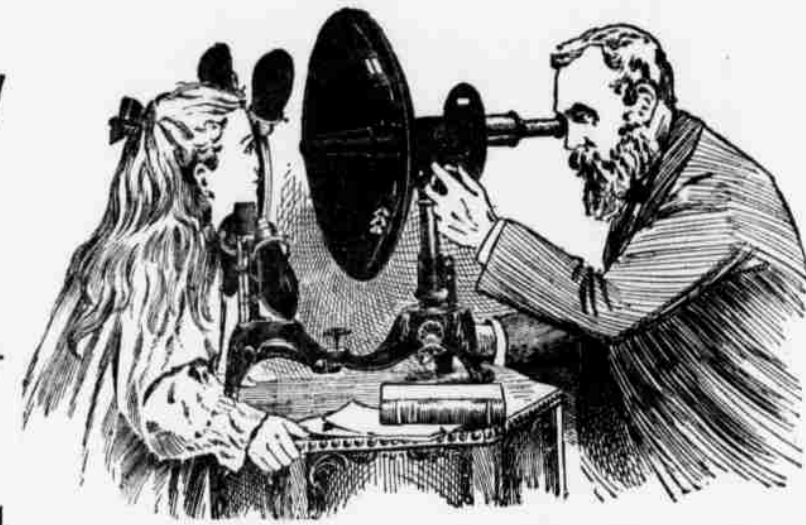
