N. Y. MARKET LOADED VIRGINIA USES BOX

Reports in the eastern fruit trade papers are to the effect that there have been heavy receipts of Western box apples in New York, but in spite of this No. 18, Ore. & Wash. Limited puoted for Hood River apples are not as high as in some other years, but they are the top prices listed and there is a fair margin of profit for the buyers at that end. As all the Union

pack was sold F. O. B. here the growers have no immediate gain or loss resulting from the price received by the jobbers. Many consignment shippers are not getting altogether satisfactory results. Some Watson-ville California Newtowns were only netting the growers 35 to 55 cents a box. Hood River Newtowns have been seliling in London at \$3,25 or twice as much as the English are paying for the California apple.

A letter in one of the papers from Richmond contains the following. "We notice that our Virginia people have gone very heavily into the box business. The Rose Cliff Orchard proper brought an experienced packer from Hood River and the effect is very perceptible,"
